Cabinet Meeting Minutes
June 5, 2017
Hosted by the House Springs Lions Club

- **Call To Order:** at 7:00 p.m. by District Governor Jack Lenk (Webster Groves Lions Club)
- **Pledge:** lead by Lion Vicky Swederska (Webster Groves Lions Club)
- **Song:** 2nd VDG Duane DeClue (DeSoto Lions Club)
- **Invocation:** lead by Lion Kathy Pusateri (Fenton Lions Club)
- **Moment of Silence**
- **Appointment of Tail Twister:** The District Cabinet Members appointed PDG Elmer Weinrich (Chesterfield Lions Club), of which the proceeds will be utilized to assist the flood victims.
- **Introduction of Guests/First Time Attendees:** Don Barry and Chris Gray (guest speaker, representing Mo Council for the Blind) and David Ekin, his driver.

- **Adjourned for Dinner/Reconvened @ 7:45 pm**

- **Guest Speaker Presentation:** Chris Gray, with Mo Council for the Blind and Visually Impaired stated that 70% of blind adults are unable to work. The majority of blind youth feel isolated. August 3 – August 6, Mo Council for the Blind will be hosting a conference, Amazon Echo, at the Marriott West Hotel for blind individuals. Further information regarding this conference is available at moblind.org. There is no cost to the participants, with the exception of their meals. Chris encouraged donations of \$35 per person for their meal and volunteers to assist during this event.
David Ekin stated that Mo Society for the Blind serves children and adults who are blind or visually impaired. Approximated 1,200 individuals per year are provided with assistance. The Lions have been so important in assisting those with visual impairments. Adult services are primarily for elderly people whose vision is affected due to macular degeneration, glaucoma, cataracts and diabetic rhenurothopy. David requested that District 26-M2 appoint a Mo Society for the Blind Chairperson (liaison) who can learn more about their services and to share it with the district. David is available to provide a presentation for Lions Clubs and during Zone Meetings.

- **Secretary Report:** Lion Kathy Pusateri reported that the minutes of the March March 24 - 26 District Convention had been emailed to the addresses available and copies provided at the information table. Lion Kathy asked for any corrections or additions; none were made. A motion was made by Lion Lynn Karrer (Meramec Heights Lions Club) to accept the minutes, which was seconded by Lion Vicky Swederska. Motion passed. Lion Kathy thanked DG Jack for allowing her to serve as Cabinet Secretary.

- **Treasurer Report:** Lion Vicky Swederska read and provided copies of the report. The report reflects account activities for ending May 31, 2017. During the District Convention, a total of \$71,843.67 was collected from many Lions Clubs. The funds were disbursed to the following organizations: Mo School for the Blind, District Hearing, Disaster Relief, Blind Bowlers, State Hearing, World Services for the Blind, St. Patrick Center, US Association for Blind Athletes, Lions Eye Foundation, Midwestern Braille, American Diabetes Assoc., Mid South, Mo Athletes, Outreach Youth, Delta Gamma Center, District Eye Care, Leader Dog, LCIF, Saving Sight, Kids Sight, District Sight Committee, Amblyopia Screening, Heartland Eye Bank, Lions Youth Exchange, LBOMB and Mo Lions All Star Football. The Service Activity account has a balance of \$38,875.94. The Administrative Account balance is \$47,435.55. A motion was made by Lion Kathy Pusateri to accept the Treasurer Report, which was seconded by Lion Jeff Rackovan (Zone 2 Chairperson, Mehlville Lions Club). Motion passed.

- **Zone Chairperson Reports {lead by 2nd VDG Duane DeClue (DeSoto Lions Club)}:**

- **Zone 1: Lion Larry Bridges (DeSoto Lions Club):** no report

- **Zone 2: Lion Jeff Rackovan (Mehlville Lions Club):** The Concord Village Lions Club has 100 members, with the potential of 2 new members. During the club's Governor's Visit, the club donated \$35,000 to various organizations. The club's recent fundraising events raised \$38,500. The Concord Village Lions Club will be hosting a golf tournament soon. The Mehlville Lions Club has 26 members, with the potential of 1 new member, which is equivalent to a +38%. The club participated in the Eye Glass Wrap and assisting the flood victims and in the process of organizing an event to raise awareness of the Mehlville Lions Club in the community. The Pevely Lions Club is +2 in membership. Lion Karen Tegeler of the Lemay J.B. Lions Club has been installed as the Club Secretary. The club's recent Candy Days was successful.

- **Zone 3: Lion Lynda Heald (Fenton Lions Club):** All the clubs are very active, hosting BBQ's, etc. 2nd VDG Duane DeClue and Lion Lynda hosted a Zone Meeting, which was hosted by the Valley Park Lions Club, which assisted several clubs in achieving their Club Excellence Award. There were approximately 22 Lions in attendance.
- **Zone 4: Lion Tom Lagemann (New Haven Lions Club):** All of the clubs have completed their PU-101's. The Beaufort Lions Club had a successful Easter Egg Hunt and held the last shooting match for the season 4/9. The club will host a quilt raffle 5/12 and they continue to host Bingo every Friday night. The New Haven Lions Club provided 90 dozen eggs during their Easter Egg Hunt they donated seedlings to the area grade schools, for Arbor Day. The club provided two East Central College scholarships. The club's annual Pancake Supper, raised \$1,400, which was donated to the New Haven Little League for a new batting cage. The St. Clair Lions Club are hosting a Golf Tournament 5/13. The Washington Lions Club held Candy Days and an Adopt-A-Highway cleanup that included ROTC Cadets and Leo Club Members, they held an Amblyopia screening at the YMCA and they will be providing Glaucoma screenings at the Senior Health Fair, at East Central College. The club will be bartending during a chamber Mixer and will be selling pork burgers at the Washington Spring Art and Wine Fest, 5/19 – 5/21. The Gerald Lions Club sold Krispy Kreme donuts and hosted a Rabies Vaccination Clinic. The club will be hosting Karaoke soon and are considering hosting a Total Eclipse Party in August.
- **Zone 5: Lion Pam Manuel (Pacific Lions Club):** In May, the Cuba Lions Club served lunch to 84 of the Cuba High School Senior young men and their fathers at the Cuba Lions Club Hall. They were impressed with the hall and asked many questions about what the Cuba Lions do and how they serve the community. The club awarded five \$500 scholarships to graduating seniors from Bourbon, Steelville and Cuba High School. The Cuba Lions Club hosted their monthly community dinner, serving dinner to 56 members of the community, at no charge. On 5/26, the Cuba Lions Club held their 52th annual Memorial Day BBQ fundraiser. The Eureka Lions Club will be hosting their first Zone Meeting, 6/25. The club's BBQ's, as well as their annual Bowling Tournament were successful. The Gray Summit Lions Club has been providing assistance with the flood relief. They will be participating in the Relay for Life, 6/16 at Pacific High School and will be hosting a picnic on 9/19. The Pacific Lions Club will be hosting a clean-up, as a result of the flood 6/11. They will be selling burgers during a Car Show, 6/24, placing flags on businesses on 7/4, hosting the Pacific Lions Scholarship winners and the 2017 Youth Exchange Students 7/19. The Union Lions Club had Candy Days 4/7 and 4/9 and 4/21 they hosted a soup kitchen for The Homelessness Project at Union High School. They will be selling hot dogs and burgers during the 4th of July Celebration and 7/6 – 7/9 they will be selling desserts during the Franklin County Youth Fair in Union.

- **Zone 6: Lion Teddi Speeler (Webster Groves Lions Club):** The St. Louis Downtown Lions Club continue working on the community bench they are providing to celebrate Founder's Day and they will be assisting the Webster Groves Lions Club during their 4th of July Carnival. Lion Eugene will be participating in the LCI Convention Parade. The South Side Lions Club continue to drive blind bowlers and provide assistance with eye exams and eye glasses. The Webster Groves Lions Club will be having a BBQ and blood drive 6/9 & 6/10. The Club will be having their annual 4th of July Carnival. The SLU Lions Club have been assisting the Webster Groves Lions Club with their BBQ's during May and will be helping during the 4th of July Carnival. The club awarded 11 (\$1,000 ea) scholarships to Webster Groves High School Seniors and they installed a new member in May. DG Jack Lenk's last Governor's Visit was in April. Members of several Lions Clubs attended the Easter Egg Hunt with 200+ kids participating and 3,000+ eggs.
- **Zone 7: Lion Sue Templeton (Maplewood Lions Club):** As most of you know, Lion Jean Martin passed away Sunday morning. She will be greatly missed! She has been an active member of the Maplewood Lions Club, serving as Membership Chairperson, Food Chairperson and at the district level as Region Chairperson. The visitation for Lion Jean will be 6/7, from 12:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. at J.B. Smith Funeral Home, in Maplewood. There will be a Rose Ceremony. Following the service, will be an outdoor reception, celebrating the life of Lion Jean, which will be held at the homes of Lion Leslie McEntire and Lion Georgia McGuire. Lion Bob Berry, President of the Mid Town Lions Club has completed chemo treatment for cancer. He wishes to thank everyone for their thoughts and prayers. The St. Ferdinand Lions Club is dissolving, as of 6/30, due to the loss of many members. The Maplewood Lions Club is busy as usual. The Installation of Officers is 6/6. DG Jack presented a certificate to Lion Sue, to give to the Ferguson Lions Club.

- **District Convention; PCC Gina Boettcher (Beaufort Lions Club):** What a Convention! The Convention Committee is working diligently preparing for the State Convention and will provide further information in the coming months. - **GMT; 2nd VDE George Winkeler, Jr. (House Springs Lions Club):** Currently, membership is +1 for the month and -13 for the year, with a total of 1,430 members. Clubs are finding that by increasing the fun, membership increases. We are in the process of forming a new club, "Twin Cities". 2nd VDE George introduced Lion Pam Manuel as the new GMT Coordinator, beginning 7/1 and ending 6/30/2019.
- **LBOMB; 2nd VDE George Winkeler, Jr.:** Thank you to all of the Lions Clubs for their support. Donations have allowed LBOMB to replace aging machines, remodel stores and increase training. To date donations consist of: \$4,150 from M2, \$11,549 state wide, which, with the 80/20 matching grant, equates to \$57,745. LBOMB provides training and great paying jobs! To date, there are 35 facilities, 7 level one vending, 6 level two C-Stores, 9 level two point five vending, 5 snack bars and 8 cafeterias. There are 36K+ meals a day served in Fort Leonard Wood. The negotiations to continue is still in limbo.
- **Lions Opportunity for Youth; Lion Toni Mahoney (Richwoods Lions Club):** Eleven youths from Brazil, Finland, France, Germany, Israel, Italy and Turkey have been accepted to participate in the Youth Exchange Program; 5 young ladies and 6 young men. There are 4 different Lion families and 1 Leo family from our district who are hosting: Lions Teddi and Lion Becky Speeler, Lion Joyce Neikirk and Lions Larry and Lion Angie Sontag, Lion Toni Mahoney and PCC John Yount and Michelle Kenny, a member of the Washington Leo Club. The meet and great, including a meal, will be 7/9, at 1:00 p.m., at the House Springs Lions Club Hall. Please RSVP to Lion Kim Fanter (House Springs Lions Club) if you plan to attend. The youths will go to Six Flags, 7/19, and will be served dinner by the Pacific Lions Club. They will attend camp at Camp Brim Shire, in St. James, from 7/30 – 8/6. They will be visiting Saving Sight in Columbia, for a service project, tour Jefferson City, the Lions State Office and Fort Leonard Wood and will be served dinner by the Washington Lions Club 7/25. - **State Athletics; Lion Michelle Foster (Beaufort Lions Club):** The All Star Football Game will be 7/22. Tickets are \$8 in advance or \$10 the day of the game. Ads for the program are still be accepted. Three youths from our district will be participating.
- **Delta Gamma CenterKids; Lion Barb Kurkowski (Maplewood Lions Club):** In celebration of National Volunteer Month, DGCKids thanks the nearly 900 volunteers for supporting the center's mission. The 25th Annual Run for Sight had 1,100 participants, raising over \$126,000. The center also participated in the 24 hour on-line day of giving for St. Louis and raised a total of \$4,430. The Grads Group have started their monthly tandem bike rides.
- **Diabetes; Lion Ruth Boyer (Beaufort Lions Club):** Diabetes can affect you physically and emotionally. Living with it every day can make you feel discouraged, stressed or even depressed. Sometimes depression can be difficult to diagnose. Talk to a psychologist, social worker or diabetes educator if you: avoid discussing your diabetes with family and friends, sleep most of the day, don't see the benefit in taking care of yourself or if you feel like diabetes is conquering you. People living with diabetes can learn healthy coping methods that help them recognize and manage their physical and emotional problems. Build healthy relationships and remember that you're not alone.
- **District Hearing; PCC John Yount (Richwoods Lions Club):** PCC John thanked everyone who participated in the 50/50 raffle. Nobody from M2 won at the State Convention drawing. There are currently 7 applications, for assistance with hearing, pending.
- **District Sight Hotline; Lion Mike Swederska (Webster Groves Lions Club):** The hotline received 288 calls, of which 250 applications were mailed. The following bills were paid to the University of MO St. Louis Optometric Center: Jan \$225; Feb \$470; March \$0; April \$345; May \$900. The cost for the answering machine is \$92 per month. The hotline received 7 calls for assistance with hearing, which were forwarded to the Hearing Committee and 11 calls were received for assistance with eye surgeries.
- **Lions Eye Foundation; PCC Charlie Hartmann (Lemay J.B. Lions Club):** PCC Charlie reported that the Lions Eye Foundation will be purchasing a MacBook Air computer for Kayla Peka. Kayla is visually impaired and needs this computer in order to attend

Southeast MO University. In the near future, she will also need a Leader Dog. Due to low attendance during the past several years during the Lions Eye Foundation's Annual Meeting, PCC Charlie reported that the Board Members all agree in recommending that the next Annual Meeting be held prior to the start of the District Cabinet Meeting in August.

- **Midwestern Braille; PDG Eugene Taylor (Brentwood Lions Club):** Midwestern Braille is organizing an "Appreciation Day", during the Cardinals Baseball Game, 6/24. The cost is \$45 per ticket, which normally costs \$65 per ticket.
- **Saving Sight;** Lion Patrick Martchink (House Springs Lions Club): Both Saving Sight and Kids Sight are 503C organizations.
- **Used Eye Glasses; PDG Elmer Weinrich (Chesterfield Lions Club):** On 5/13, the Maplewood Lions Club hosted an Eye Wrap. There were approximately 20,000 used eye glasses and 3 boxes of junk sorted. There were 22 Lions in attendance, representing 9 clubs. We would like to thank the Maplewood Lions Club for the use of the VFW Post 3500 and for helping in taking care of the food and drinks. On 5/16, PDG Elmer and Lion Janet Weinrich delivered 20,010 used eye glasses to Saving Sight, in Columbia, MO. PDG Elmer has 10,000 used eye glasses, which will be picked up by PDG Bill Heaston, from Little Rock, AR. They will be washed, dried, the prescriptions read and packaged, then will be shipped to Honduras. PDG Jim Bernhardt collects used eye glasses. For the 2016/2017 Lionistic year, a total of 57,963 eye glasses have been collected. Thank you, DG Jack, for allowing PDG Elmer, PDG Jim Bernhardt (Fenton Lions Club) and Lion Devin Struttman (Union Lions Club) to serve.
- **Mo School for the Blind;** Lion Anna Schell (Maplewood Lions Club): Lion Anna thanked everyone who attended the Lions Appreciation Night and Open House and encouraged anyone who has any suggestions of what they would like to see during future Lions Appreciation Night and Open House.
- **Old Business:** Lion Kathy Pusateri reminded everyone of the announcement, which was made during the District Convention. The proceeds collected from Lions and Lions Clubs, as a sign of appreciation of DG Jack's leadership, while serving his term, was used to purchase an LCI Life-Time Membership for DG Jack. Lion Kathy presented the Certificate and a pin, from LCI.
- **New Business:** * Upon the completion of the Zone 5 Chairperson report, DGE Joe Detter reported that there is still financial assistance needed for the flood victims. DGE Joe encouraged District 26-M2 to provide financial assistance. CC Joe Foster made a motion that District 26-M2 provide \$5,000 for the flood victims, which was seconded. Motion passed. ** Lion Becky Speeler, who is serving on the 2018 State Convention Committee reported that she and Lion Sue Templeton are collecting Lions shirts from clubs, with the club name on it, which will be cut to size and used to make a quilt. 2nd VDGE George Winkeler, Jr. reported that the St. Ferdinand Lions Club donated \$1,100 to District 26-M2.
- **DGE Closing Remarks:** "It's hot, let's go home."
- **DG Closing Remarks:** DG Jack thanked all of the clubs, the Zone Chairs, Committee Chairpersons, Cabinet Members, his Advisors and the Webster Groves Lions Club for their support, it is not just a one-man operation but, a team effort. It has been a joy serving as your DG and will be leaving this District in good hands with DGE Joe Detter. DG Jack would like for the district to get more involved with the Mo Society for the Blind. If the sun doesn't return after the eclipse in August, he is available, as a guide.
