## Eye Mission Foundation on the Roll

The eyeglasses you collect, and sort are now being distributed to residents of Missouri. The fourth Missouri mission was held the August 13 in Kansas City at the Catholic Charities complex giving 89 people recycled eyeglasses. One three-year-old girl received her first pair of glasses and was delighted with them, and her parents were very appreciative.

St. Peter's and Paul Church was the site of our first mission back in November. We gave 39 homeless people recycled eyeglasses and found two with cataracts and one with glaucoma that were referred to M2's Eye Care committee.

Based on that experience the St. Louis Archdiocese Parish Rural Medical Clinic asked us to partner with them and screen people at some of their clinics. So far, we have done two with them at St. Clare church in St. Clair screening 8 and 9 people respectively. Yes, the numbers are small, but we helped give better vision to those we served. One person had just been to a doctor and told she had high pressure and the start of glaucoma but because she had no insurance, he didn't treat her for the glaucoma. We referred her to St. Clair Lions for treatment assistance.

Our second mission was in Mexico, Missouri where we screened 35 people who were living at or below the poverty level. This mission was on a Sunday and Mexico Lions provided a site, doctors and volunteers. Lions from M2 are taking the lead in setting up and organizing these missions no matter where they are in the state.

The third mission was in March and back at St. Peter's and Paul in Soulard. Once again, our numbers were not large, only 35 but those we gave the recycled eyeglasses to can now lead a better life because of improved vision.

As previously said the fourth mission was in Kansas City this past weekend. We have a mission scheduled for the Covenant House in St. Louis Sunday, August 20. We estimate the numbers will once again be in the 30s and these are homeless youths and young adults who have no financial ability to get vision care.

Currently we only have one additional mission scheduled. Springfield Lions will host a mission September 30. Almost 20% of Springfield's population are considered to be living at or below the poverty level. They estimate a minimum of 100 people will be pre-registered for this mission.

Continue to collect eyeglasses that we can sort, clean, read and recycle for use by those who can't afford to purchase glasses or even pay for an eye exam. M2 Lions Devin Struttmann, Leon Hove, Kimberly Taylor and Missy Maune are all serving as officers and on the board of the Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation.

We are preparing to ask LCIF for a grant to purchase additional equipment that is more up to date and efficient than what we are now using to screen people. We also are searching for environmentally controlled storage to house the equipment and recycled eyeglasses ready for distribution instead of someone's house or basement. If you are looking for a place to donate that will benefit those in need the Foundation can use the money for ongoing expenses and the matching grant.

We haven't abandoned trips to Mexico and Panama to give recycled eyeglasses to people in those countries. Seven lions traveled to Mexico in March and five from M2 are signed up to go to Mexico in October. We have been assured by Lions in sight of California and Nevada that they will set aside two trips for Missouri Lions to fill next year. Probably one to Mexico and the other to Panama. If you are interested in participating in a foreign mission talk to one of the board members for more information.

We also need volunteers to go on the Missouri missions. The archdiocese has medical clinics at some location every week and would love to have Lions there to screen people at any of their clinics. If we tell them we can have someone there they will publicize and take advance reservations. Currently only Lion Hove is transporting equipment and glasses to the mission sites. He would gladly accept help with that job as well.

If you have contacts where there is a need for vision screening let one of us know. We can hold screenings as time and volunteers permits anyplace. Maybe you know of a company or organization that would like to partner or donate. We are a 501 C3 corporation so all donations are tax deductible to the full extent of the law.

Do you Remember Lion Friendly?

Several years ago, Lion Friendly traveled throughout our district from club to club. Some say he got mange; others dressed him up and one Lions even built him a cage. No one knows where he is today but we now have a new traveling Lion.

Lion LCIF exists thanks to Lion Eugene Morse's wife who gave him and a few other things to us to see if we could raise money for the Lions from them. He is rather large with a 38" neck. He has started his travels around the district with the Union Lions who plan to help him along the way with a visit to Wildwood Area Lions.

There are two purposes behind Lion LCIF.

One: To raise money for LCIF. If a club keeps Lion LCIF longer than two weeks after having received it from another club, they are "assessed a fine" of \$25 payable to LCIF. Lion Leon Hove or Lion Devin Struttmann will be happy to take the check. Each additional period results in another "fine". Of course, all are encouraged to make a "fine" donation to LCIF even if they help Lion LCIF along the way in his travels before the two weeks.

Two: Encourage interaction between clubs and members. Hopefully when a club brings Lio LCIF to another club they will have a delegation and the members of the two clubs will exchange ideas.

LCIF has given our district grants to purchase SPOT vision cameras, a tonometer and peripheral vision equipment, several disaster grants to various clubs including St. Louis, Union, Pacific, Valley Park and De Soto. The Springfield area just received a matching grant of \$100,000 for an all-abilities park. The Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation is preparing a grant request now for new and additional equipment.

LCIF does not just distribute money overseas and in third world countries. We receive much more here in the USA than we contribute. Please consider a contribution on a personal level. Why not commit a dime a day or just \$3.00 a month. You could set that up as a regular deduction out of your bank account or on your credit card.

## **NEED FOR EDUCATIONAL SURROGATES**

I am reaching out to various organizations because the State of Missouri has reached a critical state-wide shortage of people willing to volunteer in the role of educational surrogates for students with disabilities who are served on Individual Education Plans (IEPs) in school.

IEP Teams meet person or virtually to determine the appropriate educational program for students with disabilities. Parents of students with disabilities are typically a very important part of this team. Sometimes, for various reasons, there is no one to fill the role of parent at IEP Team meetings. That is when an educational surrogate would be requested. They are an impartial individual who fills the role of parent for a student with a disability whenever decisions are being made about the student's educational placement and individualized education program (IEP) when there is no natural parent or other adult authorized to make educational decisions on behalf of the student.

An educational surrogate must be 18 years old or older, have completed the required online training (<u>https://www.moedu-sail.org/educational-surrogate-training/</u>) and have no criminal record for child abuse or neglect. An educational surrogate must not have any conflict of interest concerning the student's education; an educational surrogate may not be an employee of a public agency providing care, custody, or educational services to the specific student in need of educational surrogate representation. Which means that state employees cannot be educational surrogates for DYS students.

Correct Operating Procedures for this year for processing requests. The Correct Operating Procedure is noted as follows:

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website <u>https://lions26m2.org/resources.html</u> for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- 7. The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
  - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
  - a. Assigned
  - b. In progress
  - c. Forwarded
  - d. Closed (Complete)
- 9. If <u>ANY</u> Lions club receives an independent request <u>OUTSIDE</u> of the LAS line, please contact the LAS chair with the following information.
  - a. Date received
  - b. Requestors Name
  - c. ZIP CODE
  - d. Club Name assisting
  - e. Date of completion
