**Secretary's Report:** PDG Sandee Marshall reported that the minutes of the October 2, 2023, Cabinet meeting had been distributed and were also in the District newsletter. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by Lion Pam Manuel (Pacific) to accept the minutes as presented; second by Lion Teddi Speeler (Webster Groves). Motion passed. PDG Marshall reminded those present that food will not be ordered for the February meeting but everyone is encouraged to bring food to enjoy in fellowship with their fellow Lions.

**Treasurer's Report:** Lion Joe Schroeder reported a balance of \$31,412.88 in the Service Activity account and \$96,176.76 in total assets as of December 1, 2023. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by IPDG Leon Hove to accept the report as presented; second by 1<sup>st</sup> VDG Michelle Foster. Motion passed. **Governor's Opening Remarks:** DG Paul Carr reminded everyone that his emphasis this year is on service and service reporting.

**Old Business:** DG Carr asked for any completed Quality Lion Award forms. PCC Kimberly Taylor and PDG Eugene Taylor received awards for the 2022-2023 year. The District winner of the Peace Poster contest was sponsored by the Hillsboro Lions Club; the poster advanced to State competition.

**New Business**: PDG Sandee Marshall presented the 2022-2023 District audit report for Lion Robert Ell (Bonhomme). DG Carr reported that only 25 of 37 clubs have scheduled their Governor's visit. Nominations for District Governor, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governor and a director of the District 26-M2 Eye Foundation Board will be made at the February Cabinet meeting. Raffle tickets for the Hearing sweepstakes to benefit statewide hearing projects were distributed to the clubs represented at the meeting and to Zone Chairs; they must be returned before the District convention. Officer training will be held at the District convention before the beginning of hospitality night and after the last session on Sunday. PDG Sandee Marshall gave a reminder about the fall/winter service project to benefit Canterbury Industries by helping to fulfill their Easter orders. Call her to reserve a Saturday morning in January or February. PCC Kimberly Taylor clarified the new delegate formula that was voted in at the International Convention in Boston.

**LCIF Grant Requests:** PDG Devin Struttmann, LCIF co-chair, presented a previously discussed request for an LCIF District Community Impact Grant for \$1300 to fund the one-year rental of signage along I-64 in Chesterfield to promote brand awareness and humanitarian projects. Motion by IPDG Leon Hove to submit the application; second by PCC Kimberly Taylor. Motion passed.

IPDG Leon Hove, LCIF co-chair, presented a proposal for a LCIF Matching Grant by the Missouri Eye Mission Foundation for \$19,250 for additional equipment and storage of same to facilitate the new in-state

eye missions program. \$19,250 has already been received/pledged from individual Lions Clubs, the 26-M2 Eye Foundation and the Missouri Eye Mission Foundation. The total amount from contributions and the grant is \$38,500. Motion by Lion Pam Manuel submit the application; second by Lion Vickey Engel. Motion passed.

**Holiday Sweater Contest:** Lion Judy Yingling (Maplewood) won 1<sup>st</sup> place and IPDG Leon Hove (Washington) won 2<sup>nd</sup> place for the ugliest sweaters. Lion Cyndi Carr (House Springs) won 1<sup>st</sup> place and Lion Nikki Hull (Webster Groves) won 2<sup>nd</sup> place for the prettiest sweaters. All winners received \$25 QT gift cards.

**Attendance Prizes:** \$25 gift cards to QT were won by PCC Gina Boettcher (Beaufort) and Lion Janet Weinrich (Chesterfield).

1<sup>st</sup> VDG Closing Remarks: 1<sup>st</sup> VDG Michelle wished everyone "Happy holidays" and complimented them on the many parades and services activities this season. She was personally moved hearing what disadvantaged children were asking of Santa at a recent event.

**DG Closing Remarks:** With 6 months of the year completed, DG Paul Carr reminded us of his goal and commitment to service and fellowship. His next "State of the District" zoom meeting will be held on Sunday, January 7<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m.; ID Lee Vrieze, our convention speaker, will be the special guest. Deadline for submissions to the next issue of the newsletter is December 12<sup>th</sup>.

### Lion LCIF

Do you Remember Lion Friendly?

Several years ago, Lion Friendly traveled throughout our district from club to club. Some say he got mange; others dressed him up and one Lions even built him a cage. No one knows where he is today but we now have a new traveling Lion.

Lion LCIF exists thanks to Lion Eugene Morse's wife who gave him and a few other things to us to see if we could raise money for the Lions from them. He is rather large with a 38" neck. He has started his travels around the district with the Union Lions who plan to help him along the way with a visit to Wildwood Area Lions.

There are two purposes behind Lion LCIF.

One: To raise money for LCIF. If a club keeps Lion LCIF longer than two weeks after having received it from another club, they are "assessed a fine" of \$25 payable to LCIF. Lion Leon Hove or Lion Devin Struttmann will be happy to take the check. Each additional period results in another "fine". Of course, all are encouraged to make a "fine" donation to LCIF even if they help Lion LCIF along the way in his travels before the two weeks.

Two: Encourage interaction between clubs and members. Hopefully when a club brings Lio LCIF to another club they will have a delegation and the members of the two clubs will exchange ideas.

LCIF has given our district grants to purchase SPOT vision cameras, a tonometer and peripheral vision equipment, several disaster grants to various clubs including St. Louis, Union, Pacific, Valley Park and De Soto. The Springfield area just received a matching grant of \$100,000 for an all-abilities park. The Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation is preparing a grant request now for new and additional equipment.

LCIF does not just distribute money overseas and in third world countries. We receive much more here in the USA than we contribute. Please consider a contribution on a personal level. Why not commit a dime a day or just \$3.00 a month. You could set that up as a regular deduction out of your bank account or on your credit card.

Correct Operating Procedures for this year for processing requests. The Correct Operating Procedure is noted as follows:

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website <a href="https://lions26m2.org/resources.html">https://lions26m2.org/resources.html</a> for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- 7. The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
  - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
  - a. Assigned
  - b. In progress
  - c. Forwarded
  - d. Closed (Complete)
- 9. If <u>ANY</u> Lions club receives an independent request <u>OUTSIDE</u> of the LAS line, please contact the LAS chair with the following information.
  - a. Date received
  - b. Requestors Name
  - c. ZIP CODE
  - d. Club Name assisting
  - e. Date of completion
