West St. Louis County/Eureka Lions take Christmas Gifts to Missouri School for the Blind



December 20, 2012 marked the tenth consecutive year that members of the West St. Louis County/Eureka Lions Club attended the "Christmas Extravaganza" program and party at the Missouri School for the Blind. All the gifts given to the students at the party were purchased at the Wal-Mart and Dickey Bub's in Eureka. In addition to the individual gifts the students opened, the Lions provided clothing which will be distributed as needed throughout the school year.

One of the major goals of the Lions is eye care and the prevention of blindness, as

The Missouri School for the Blind (MSB), established in 1851, is a public school for legally blind Missouri children ages 5-21 operated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). MSB, which is fully accredited by both state and national organizations, provides curriculum instruction that is fully aligned with state standards, as well as specialized classes in orientation and mobility, Braille, adaptive physical education, daily living skills, transition *and adaptive technology*. Students may attend MSB free of charge on a day or residential school basis or may attend KEYS - a short course program (3-18 weeks) for intensive instruction in a selected area. Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities such as music, swimming, cheerleading, goalball, wrestling, track and field, and special interest clubs. Missouri School for the Blind also offers, on an as-needed basis, physical and occupational therapy, nursing care, counseling and access to physicians and dentists.

The mission of Missouri School for the Blind is to provide individualized instruction, resources and educational services ensuring that students with visual impairments achieve the academic, social, employment, and life skills empowering them to enjoy full productive lives.

District 26-M2 2012-2013 Constitution and By-Law Proposed Changes

PROPOSITION NO. 1

A CHANGE TO THE CONSTITUTION TO ESTABLISH THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE PDG ORGANIZATION AS A VOTING MEMBER OF THE DISTRICT CABINET.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article IV, Section 1 of the District 26-M2 Constitution be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. CABINET AND OFFICERS. The District shall have a District Cabinet composed of the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, the First and Second Vice District Governors, the Region Chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the District Governor's term), the Zone Chairpersons and a Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer or a Cabinet Secretary and a Cabinet Treasurer and the Chairperson of the 26-M2 PDG Organization. The members of the District Cabinet shall be the officers of the District. Each such officer shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the District.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

A CHANGE TO THE BY-LAWS TO ESTABLISH THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE PDG ORGANIZATION AS A VOTING MEMBER OF THE DISTRICT CABINET.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article II, Section 1(c) of the District 26-M2 By-Laws be amended to read as follows:

(c) Quorum and Vote. The attendance of a majority of the members of the Cabinet shall constitute a quorum for any meeting. In all such meetings, the voting privilege shall extend to the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, First and Second Vice District Governors, the Region Chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the District Governor's term), Zone Chairpersons, Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer (or Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer) and the Chairperson of the 26-M2 PDG Organization.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Article III, Section 1 of the District 26-M2 By-Laws be amended by deleting Section 1 in its entirety and substituting the following:

Section 1. NOMINATING COMMITTEE.

- (a) The 26-M2 Past District Governors Organization will appoint three of its members to serve as the District Nomination Committee for the offices of District Governor, Vice District Governor, and Second Vice Governor. The chairperson of Nominating Committee shall be determined by the chairperson of 26-M2 PDG Organization.
- (b) 26-M2 Past District Governors Organization Chairperson will notify the District Governor by written or electronic notification, received at least sixty (60) days prior to the District Convention, the names of the members of the Nominating Committee, each of whom shall be a member in good standing of a different Lions club in good standing in the District.
- (c) The District Governor shall send to all clubs in the District by written or electronic notification at least thirty (30) days prior to the convening day of the District Convention the names and addresses of Lions so appointed to the Nominating Committee.
- (d) The Nominating Committee shall be responsible for encouraging qualified candidates for the above offices, reviewing the qualifications of each nominated candidate and rule on the eligibility of the same, and presentation for election.

Matter to be deleted is shown stricken through; new matter is shown <u>underlined</u>.

Delegates Decide Constitution/By-Laws Changes, Officers

At the 5th Annual District 26-M2 Convention on March 23, 2013, the eligible delegates from the clubs will be voting on the offices of District Governor 2013-2014, 1st Vice District Governor, 2nd Vice District Governor and a Representative to the District 26-M2 Eye Foundation for 2013-2018, and a board member for the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation 2013- 2016.

There will also one Constitution and By-Laws issue on the ballot. These will be simple housekeeping changes give the PDG Organization certain rights and responsibilities at the District level.

The proposed changes will be will be placed on the District website www.lions26m2.org.

As a reminder, each club in District 26-M2, in good standing, shall be entitled to one voting delegate and one alternate for each ten (10) members of said club, or major fraction thereof, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, as shown by the records of Lions International on the first day of February. Each Past District Governor and the current District Governor shall be entitled to be a delegate to and vote at the Convention, in addition to those delegates to which a club may be entitled.

The District Secretary will be providing a list of each club identifying eligible number of delegates and 'good standing' status of each club:

- 1) All District and International Dues must be paid in full
- 2) Old balances to Lions International of more than \$50.00, ninety (90) days past due, must be paid
- 3) Entrance fees for new members affecting voting strength of more than one (1) delegate must be paid.

Delinquent dues may be paid and good standing acquired at any time prior to the close of credential certification on March 23rd.

Dear Lions,

As I write this message to you I am visiting our headquarters in Oak Brook, IL, where the temperature outside is 12 degrees F (-11 C). But weather - cold, hot, rain, snow - has never stopped Lions. In a world of service, "We Serve" in every climate around the world.

One of our most significant service achievements this year has been the Reading Action Program (RAP). So far this year, there have been over 46,000 RAP projects completed. That means hundreds of thousands of people are either learning to read or receiving materials to better their education because of Lions efforts. At the same time, I was surprised to learn on some of my recent visits that Lions had not yet planned a project. RAP is a great way to engage a need that exists in virtually every community around the world, and since the Board has agreed to make RAP an extended service initiative for the next 10 years, now is the time to start a program in your community. It's easy, and so very worthwhile. Refer to the RAP guide to get started.

RAP and other service activities are a mainstay of who we are, and what we do, and also a requirement for both the <u>Excellence Award</u> and <u>District Governor Team Excellence Award</u>. With 5 months left, there is still time to complete both. Two very important elements of The Club Excellence Award - the "*How Are Your Ratings*?" and the *Community Needs Assessment* - will provide your club with tools and information to help ensure continued success. Get started today.

Your <u>club</u> or <u>district</u> should also be preparing for the third "Pit Stop." Club presidents and district governors have indicated to me how valuable the pit stops have been so far this year. The March pit stop is a time for club presidents to, among other things, have their members register for district and multiple district conventions and district governors to ensure your clubs are in good standing in advance of our International Convention.

This is also the time for you to accelerate efforts in recruiting new members. So far this year we have 113,140 new members and 727 new clubs. District governors still have time to qualify for the Winners Circle Award (Gold, Silver or Bronze level).

Finally, I am proud to announce the winners of our annual Peace Poster and Blind Essay Contest winners. Congratulations to Peace Poster Grand Prize Winner Jenny Park, 13, sponsored by the Northridge Lions Club, California, and to Lions International Essay Contest Winner Maura Loberg, 11, sponsored by the Wayne Lions Club, Nebraska. Both girls have been invited to participate in the upcoming Lions International Convention in Hamburg, Germany.

Whatever weather you are experiencing, now is the time to rev up your engines as we race toward the finish line. The checkered flag will wave an end to this year in only five short months.

Honor a Lion or Club with MLERF Haywood Snipes Society

The Haywood Snipes Society is the most prestigious honor the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation can bestow upon a Lion or Lions club. The Society was formed in honor of the late Past District Governor Haywood Snipes of Poplar Bluff, Missouri. PDG Snipes chaired the Missouri Lions Sight Committee through the 1960s and early 1970s, during which time he helped raise funds to expand the Missouri Lions Eye Bank and build what is known today as the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation.

We are happy to honor his memory and continue his legacy to the Missouri Lions through this distinguished award, which recognizes clubs that make exceptional financial contributions to the Foundation, the Lions' State Sight Project. Each time a Lions club accumulates \$10,000 in donations – since the program's inception on July 1, 1987 – a representative of the Foundation contacts the club about electing a person to this society.
