Further information will follow regarding the dedication of the grounds.

Also at the State Convention, the dues increased passed. As of July 2013 the State dues will increase by \$1.50 per year or \$.75 per billing cycle.

Update on our District Wide Service Project – Clipping Coupons for Our Troops. As of this newsletter we have mailed over 56,000 coupons for a grand total of over \$83,000.00 of potential savings for our troops and their families. WOW, doesn't that make your heart skip a beat. That's one way we're "Lighting the Heart of Lionism in You". Keep up the good work and bring those manufacturer's coupons to the cabinet meeting or give them to your zone chair.

Let's put our heart into growing our District and showing the world that District 26-M2 is doing its part to support International President Madden's theme "In a World of Service".

Wildwood Area Lions Provide Assistance to Parents

Lions are familiar with providing eye testing and eyeglasses for those in need. But the Wildwood Area Lions discovered a rather different need for a child with a rare genetic mutation.

Faith Wildschuetz, now age 3 ¹/₂, was born with a mutation of the SOX2 gene and with SOX2 anophthalmia syndrome – her eyes did not develop at all, thus rendering her completely blind.

The International Children's Anophthalmia/ Micropthalmia Network (ICAN) provides a child in Faith's condition for reevaluation by a geneticist, oculoplastic surgeon, ocularist and physiatrist. Their parents, Mike and Bridget, if attending that conference this July in Chicago, will be able to learn about new treatment and research that has developed in the last couple of years. ICAN is also a support group made up of families and professionals for families dealing with issues such as Faith's.

Upon learning of Faith and ICAN, the Wildwood Area Lions provided a \$1,500 scholarship for Faith and her parents to attend this year's conference.

This fiscal year, we made it our mission to serve every community in Missouri that has a Lions club. And we're thrilled to say that we've nearly accomplished this goal. At this point, we've reached the communities of 346 out of 368 clubs – a total of 94% of Missouri Lions clubs. Our hard-working staff in the Children's Vision Screening and Healthy Vision Screening programs deserves much of the credit, having already screened more than 38,000 children and adults this year and detected 3,266 of them to have vision problems. That's an average of 9 families in every Lions club community receiving the information they need to preserve and restore sight. Missouri Lions clubs that volunteer at our screenings and make financial contributions to our mission can take pride in knowing they have made a direct impact on the vision health of Missourians throughout the state.

While we're proud of how close we've come to reaching our goal, we still have 22 communities to go before June 30th.
