In 1940 after attending Curtiss Wright Tech he was asked to work for Curtiss Wright in St. Louis where he helped produce what would become the next big plane during World War II. He married in 1942 and built his home in Ferguson, where he still lives to day with his second wife of ten years Lion Joyce. He retired from McDonald Douglas after 34 years. He joined Ferguson Lions in June1963, with a short leave of absence to care for his ailing wife in the 1990's.

This quiet unassuming Lion believes that if Lions Clubs are to survive, existing Lions MUST recruit at least one new Lion to take their place. He asked Ferguson Lions to look around. What do you see? # Attend Sate Convention in Sedalia April 26 and Vote

Missouri Lions MD-26 2014 Proposed Changes to the Constitution and By-Laws

The following propositions have been reviewed and screened, and reflect amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Missouri Lions MD-26. They will be submitted to the voting delegates at the Multiple District Convention on April 26, 2014.

There will be five issues on the ballot this year. These include approval of the 2016 State Convention location in Springfield, MO, expanding the scope of the Athletic Committee, updating references to the new Saving Sight organization, allowing for annual financial reviews instead of more expensive financial audits, as well as some housekeeping cleanup.

### **PROPOSITION NO. 1**

A RESOLUTION TO MODIFY THE SCOPE OF THE ATHLETIC COMMITTEE TO ALLOW FOR INCREASED INVOLVEMENT BY YOUTH IN LIONS-SPONSORED ATHLETIC PROGRAMS. IT ALSO WILL ALLOW FOR MALE AND FEMALE INVOLVEMENT BY ALLOWING FOR THE EXPANSION INTO OTHER SPORTS.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article VI, Section 6 (m) of the Multiple District 26 Constitution be amended to read as follows:

State Athletic Committee -- In addition to the members appointed by the District Governors the committee may itself appoint advisors to help carry out its charge. Advisors are not entitled to vote or reimbursements for mileage expenses without prior approval by the Council. The State Athletic Committee shall be responsible for the annual All-State All-Star Football Game <u>providing and supporting athletic opportunities for Missouri youth.</u> The committee shall prepare a budget for the game <u>its activities and for the activities of its subcommittees</u> for Council approval.

### PROPOSITION NO. 2

A RESOLUTION TO ALLOW FOR AN ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE BOOKS AND ACCOUNTS AT THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR, INSTEAD OF AN ANNUAL AUDIT. THIS WAS RECOMMENDED TO THE COUNCIL BY THE CURRENT AUDITORS.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article I, Section 2 of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws be amended to read as follows:

It shall demand and receive from the Council Secretary-Treasurer financial reports, semi-annually or more frequently if necessary, and shall make provisions for an audit <u>or review</u> at the end of the fiscal year of the books and accounts of the Council Secretary-Treasurer. As soon after the close of the fiscal year as reasonably possible an audit <u>or review</u> shall be conducted, and the audit report shall be submitted to the Council at its second regular meeting.

### **PROPOSITION NO. 3**

A RESOLUTION TO INCLUDE THE PHRASE "DOING BUSINESS AS SAVING SIGHT" TO REFERENCES FOR THE MISSOURI LIONS EYE RESEARCH FOUNDATION. ON DECEMBER 1, 2013, THE MISSOURI LIONS EYE RESEARCH FOUNDATION BEGAN TO OPERATE AND DO BUSINESS UNDER THE NAME "SAVING SIGHT".

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article VI, Section 6 (b) and 6 (m) and Article VII, Section 1 of the Multiple District 26 Constitution where the name MISSOURI LIONS EYE RESEARCH FOUNDATION is used, the phrase "doing business as SAVING SIGHT" be included.

### **PROPOSITION NO. 4**

A RESOLUTION TO ALLOW FOR THE CLEANUP OF HOUSEKEEPING, GRAMMAR AND FORMATTING ISSUES WITHIN THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that where necessary throughout the Multiple District 26 Constitution and By-Laws, it shall be updated to correct minor housekeeping, grammar and formatting issues. None of these updates will change the intent of any of the Articles.

### **PROPOSITION NO. 5**

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE SITE OF THE 2016 STATE CONVENTION.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE APPROVED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that the proposed location for 2016 Multiple District Convention will be Springfield, Missouri.

# Never Too Old; New Lion at 95 Years Old

At the ripe young age of 95 years, Ray Sontag of Wildwood decided it was time to join the Lions. Ray, father of vice president Lion Larry Sontag and father-in-law of Lion Angie Sontag of the Wildwood Area Lions Club, became a newly -inducted member late last Fall.

For a number of years, now-Lion Ray has attended Club meetings and fundraisers and events. But it was after his World War II Honor Flight to Washington D.C. that he made his decision.

Ray was a 23-year old who had never traveled more than 30 miles from his home in Chesterfield when, in the Fall of 1945, he found himself on a landing boat heading for the shores of North Africa with an ammunition belt, rifle and three days of rations. His commanders told him and his fellow soldiers to grab a piece of land, hang on to it and that no boats would be taking them back home.

During his duty, he received the Bronze Star for participating in five major battles; he was in North Africa for three years as an airplane Chief Mechanic, following and supporting the Army's battle fronts.

When members of the Wildwood Area Lions Club learned of Ray's Honor Flight – and that letters of thanks for his service would be delivered to him on the flight back to St. Louis – the Lions went into action.

Ray was so overwhelmed at the Lions' written words that as soon as he returned, he said to his son Lion Larry: "I guess it is time for me to join the Lions!"

Several hundred people have been screened and several have been found to have problems ranging form just being near sighted up to already in the beginning stages of glaucoma. # Let's Continue Christmas All Year Your Help Is Appreciated

I want to thank the De Soto Lions Club for their hospitality and generosity in including me in their club. I am a full time missionary who now lives, 11 months out of the year in the Petén region of Guatemala. With the help of their consistent generosity over the years, I am able to distribute glasses in villages so remote, only the village leader actually goes to town, and then only once a month. The rest live in huts with grass roofs, dirt floors, no electricity, no water, outside wood fires to cook on. BUT now with the glasses from the De Soto Lions club I am finding pastors that can't see to read their bible when they preach. First it's hard to see by candle light, and then with failing vision from the years of this poor lighting, they just can't see well. NOW they can actually see better, which gives them more energy to study, with less headaches from eye strain. I have heard better reading, more fluent and more comprehensive sermons. (Less misquotes from misreading) So I know they are using the glasses.



Consistently honest breeds trust. The word got around and in one village, an old gentleman was led by 2 young men to my presence. They said he was "blind" and "needed glasses". My heart sank, because glasses don't cure blindness. But since I'm a missionary and used to praying, we prayed for God to heal his eyes. After the 3d pair that he tried on, he actually said he could see. And he left without his helpers guiding him, and he saw a chair to sit on all by himself, and saw the gate to open upon leaving. So what happen? Only God knows. BUT he left happy! With the faithful donations of the Lions club, I can repeatedly travel to them. This breeds trust in the villagers and together WE can help those who have no other resource and are too timid to seek help.

Blessing #2. With the help of Feed my Starving Children and De Soto Lions club, WE are feeding almost 1500 children a daily portion of protein enriched rice. Not only have I seen lethargic children gain weight and energy in villages that really eat only one meal a day. I have seen the women, who cook the food, gain self-confidence and form committees so they can HONESTLY administer the rice. The men are watching the women become accountable and they are going to the fields and working harder, bringing home more food. I'm not sure what really happens, but then they are more willing to engage in other village improvement projects. I think the most important thing they realize is, that someone actu-



ally cares, and shows it by their actions. They are used to visitors coming and" helping them" "for a price". I tell them "The price has already been paid"

That is where the faithfulness of the De Soto Lions Club is so important. And everyone can be a part. One trip is good but over the 7 years that I have been helping, trust has been built and shy frightened villagers are being helped. And I encourage all clubs to help. Generosity is not just for one club or one season, like Christmas, I am there 11 months a year. Everyone can give monthly, every little bit helps. Generosity can be done all year. 

One of the major goals of the Lions is eye care and the prevention of blindness, as well as support for youth ac-

The Missouri School for the Blind (MSB), established in 1851, is a public school for legally blind Missouri children ages 5-21 operated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). MSB, which is fully accredited by both state and national organizations, provides curriculum instruction that is fully aligned with state standards, as well as specialized classes in orientation and mobility, Braille, adaptive physical education, daily living skills, transition and adaptive technology. Students may attend MSB free of charge on a day or residential school basis or may attend KEYS - a short course program (3-18 weeks) for intensive instruction in a selected area. Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities such as music, swimming, cheerleading, goal ball, wrestling, track and field, and special interest clubs. Missouri School for the Blind also offers, on an as-needed basis, physical and occupational therapy, nursing care, counseling and access to physicians and dentists.

The mission of Missouri School for the Blind is to provide individualized instruction, resources and educational services ensuring that students with visual impairments achieve the academic, social, employment, and life skills empowering them to enjoy full productive lives.

Included for the nurses was a contacts sheet that lists representatives of the Club responsible for being assigned to that particular school in their area. This listing make it easy for referral requests.

As the children receive their glasses, they respond in gratitude. "It is heartwarming to receive children's drawings and thank-you notes," says Lion Mike Klein. The nurses, social workers and teachers have also been extremely pleased with vision assistance and this well- defined program.



# **Constitution and By-Law Changes to Be Voted on at Convention Saturday Afternoon**

# District 26-M2 2013-2014 Constitution and By-Law Proposed Changes

### PROPOSITION NO. 1

A CHANGE TO THE BY-LAWS TO CLARIFY THE AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE FUND PER CAPITA TAX, THE AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL MULTIPLE DISTRICT PER CAPITA TAX AND THE AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL PER CAPITA DISTRICT CONVENTION FUND TAX.

### SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article VI, Section 1 of the District 26-M2 By-Laws be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. DISTRICT REVENUE. To provide revenue to defray the administrative expenses of the District, an annual District administrative Fund Per Capita Tax of \$10.00 \$19.00, plus an annual Multiple District Per Capita Tax in accordance with Multiple District 26 By-Laws Article III, Section 1, is hereby levied upon each member of each club in the District and shall be collected and paid in advance by each club in two (2) equal semi-annual payments due as follows: \$9.50 per club member on September tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period July 1 to December 31; and \$9.50 per club member on March tenth of each year, to cover the semi-annual period January 1 to June 30, with billings of the same to be based upon the roster of each club as of the first days of July and January, respectively. Said tax taxes shall be paid to the Cabinet Secretary or Cabinet Treasurer (or Secretary-Treasurer) by each club in the District, except newly chartered and reorganized clubs, which shall collect and pay said per capita tax taxes on a pro-rata basis from the first day of the second month following the date of their organization or reorganization, as the case may be. Said per capita tax taxes shall be disbursed only for administrative expenses of the District and only upon approval by the District Governor's Cabinet. Disbursement therefrom shall be by checks drawn and signed by the Cabinet Treasurer.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Article VI, Section 2 of the District 26-M2 By-Laws be amended to read as follows:

Section 2. CONVENTION FUND TAX. In lieu of or in addition to a District Convention registration fee, an annual Per Capita District Convention Fund Tax of \$1.00 shall be levied upon each member of each club in the District and shall be collected and paid in advance by each club, except newly chartered and reorganized clubs, in two (2) equal semi-annual payments due as follows: \$0.50 per club member on September tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period July 1 to December 31; and \$0.50 per club member on March tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period January 1 to June 30, with billings of said tax to be based upon the roster of each club as of the first days of July and January, respectively. This tax shall be collected from the clubs by, and be remitted to, the Cabinet Secretary or Cabinet Treasurer (or Secretary-Treasurer), who shall deposit the monies so collected in a special Convention Fund account. The fund so collected shall be used exclusively for defraying expenses of District Conventions and shall be expended only by District checks drawn and signed by the Convention Committee Chairman.

Any club which is chartered or reorganized in a current fiscal year shall collect and pay said Convention Fund Per Capita Tax for said fiscal year on a pro-rata basis from the first day of the second month following the date of its organization, as the case may be.
