Reflections From Grateful Harmony Lions Member

I've had the privilege of being a member of this awesome International organization for seventeen years. I began my journey into Lionism in 1977 with Mid-Town Lions Club and transferred my membership due to a change of address to Harmony Lions Club in 2004. All I can say is WOW! I attended my first meeting and literally hit the ground running.

I've made many new friends, have chaired several committees, held Board positions and participated in all of our service projects. I enjoyed sharing in the fun and camaraderie when we held our annual White Cane, Candy Days and Game Days. I looked forward to serving and singing for the women at the Mary Culver Home when we hosted our annual Valentine's or St. Patrick's Day parties. My favorite service project was preparing and serving meals to families at the Ronald McDonald House. I love to cook and the stories shared by some of the families were indeed heart warming.

One of the most challenging, yet rewarding experiences occurred when working with our popcorn project. During the first two or three years, I participated by selling and making change at the front table and tying bags as they were filled. One day I asked to be allowed to learn to pop the corn and bag it. Several of the sighted club members were rather hesitant and had concerns for my safety because of my visual impairment. However, one Saturday afternoon, when business was a bit slow, lion George Schwoerer approached me at the front table and asked if I still wished to learn to pop corn. I enthusiastically said yes but as I approached the popper I had butterflies in my stomach. My hands trembled as I emptied the first kit of corn and oil in the popper. As my training continued, some of the concerns expressed by the sighted members became a reality. I spilled popcorn, was burned by the kettle and



the hot oil and have even burned a couple of batches. Lion George, however, never lost his temper or gave up on me. He remained patient with me and now I can stand toe to toe and pop corn with the best of them.

I certainly was not the only vision impaired person in the club. Throughout the years, the harmony Lions have installed many new blind and vision impaired members. These members possessed talents ranging from secretarial, Braille and math skills to fund raising and music. We were neither pitied nor patronized. Harmony Lions found a place for any member who wished to serve. Our club, at one time, had more blind and vision impaired members than any club in the state of Missouri. I was absolutely thrilled when my partner in service, lion Jack Lenk who is totally blind, was nominated by our members to run for the position of Second Vice District governor and was elected this past march. My highlighting experiences with harmon included my election to a two year term as Club President and my being presented with the prestigious Melvin Jones Fellowship award at the end of my presidency. I was the only black woman to sere as President of this club. It is an honor that I will always remember and is a sign that barriers throughout areas of our organization are starting to lift and the true spirit of Lionism will one day emerge for all those who wish to join and live by our motto, "We Serve".

On Wednesday, June 18, harmony Lions held its final meeting at the Missouri Council of the Blind's building. After dinner and a short awards ceremony, lion president Michael Hamm invited the club members to reflect and share their stories and experiences. Through laughter and tears, those Lions wishing to do so, took a few moments to reminisce and reflect on their experiences with the club. Following this, a list of many of our deceased Lions was read. It was always an honor for me to participate or sometime sing in a Rose Ceremony for one of our deceased Lions. I have learned something from, or have had a special memory of every member that has passed away during my membership in the club. At the conclusion of our meeting, Lion Michael led us all in a rousing chorus of The Lion roar song in memory of our honorary member, Lion Lewis Carna of the Southside Lions Club who also gave his time and assistance to our club.

Although each of our members has worked diligently in our club during the past several years. I would. However, like to express my special thanks to Lions Verneal Barlow and Lion Schopper for their many years of filling the positions secretary and Treasurer. As we disband and become members in other Lions clubs throughout our district, each of us will take from this wonderful 63 year old club, lasting friendships, the guidance and counseling from our long time members and the spirit that is truly the St. Louis harmony Lion Club.


