Missouri Lions Eye Glass Mission Trip

The group will include three Lions from District 26-M2: Dr. Sara Serati (Chesterfield), Lion Sandee Marshall (Wildwood Area), and Lion Leon Hove (Washington). The group will travel and set up on Thursday, October 13. The clinic will be held on Friday, October 14, and Saturday, October 15. The return travel will be on Sunday, October 16.

The clinic will include eye exams by a group of doctors. If a patient requires the use of eye glasses, they will work with technicians who attempt to find a good match (both prescription and cosmetic). All glasses come via the collection of used eye glasses by Lions Clubs here in the states.

Have you heard? Lions Clubs International is celebrating its 100th anniversary!! This is THE year, working up to the 100th International Convention in Chicago. Progress toward the goal of serving 100 million people by June of 2018 is spectacular. Service impacting more than 99 million people worldwide has already been reported—and we have 2 more years to go.

Notice I said service REPORTED as reporting remains a problem--but we are making progress. During the 1st year of the program, only 30% of the Clubs in our District reported service in 2 or more campaigns. (Campaigns being vision, hunger, youth and environment) Last year reporting was up to 42%; thank you to all the Club secretaries who are making that happen. Just 1 month into the 2016-2017 reporting year, 7 clubs have reported in one of the campaigns. They are: Brentwood, Cuba, Ellisville, Hillsboro, Pacific, Webster Groves and Wildwood Area. And 1 Club has already reported in 3 service areas. Congratulations De Soto! And 3 Clubs have reported a Level 1 Legacy Project. Three cheers for Fenton, Cuba and Hillsboro!

Lions, let's remember why we are doing this; it's not just about numbers and banner patches. It's about service and community awareness that "Where there's a need, there's a Lion!"

The purpose of this meeting will be to review the affairs of the organization for the past year and to transact any other business as may come before this meeting.



The Washington Town and Country Fair

The Washington Town and country Fair set records with huge crowds all five days. Friday night's crowd has been estimated at 20,000 people. Most of them were watching Alabama or the pro truck pull in the arena. Both events were standing room only.

Washington Lions were busy all five days of the fair as volunteers, putting in more hours than any other organization. Tuesday was setup time for the frozen drink stand which was open Wednesday through the close Sunday from 4 to midnight. The stand required a minimum of six and as many as twelve people to keep up with the crowds. Using an average of eight bodies for eight hours each day that totals 512 man hours just at that stand.

Friday and Saturday the Lions man all of the gates starting at 6 am on two gates and manning the five main gates until close both nights. Two to six people are required at each gate and during the evening Friday fair officials estimated we were admitting over 1,000 per hour at several gates. That's a lot of people and again a lot of man hours. Lions also man three beer stands on Sunday and the cash registers for the main food court. Many Lions are past fair board members and/or fair chairmen. We currently have lions serving on the fair board.
