This event was held in the Branson LIONS club meeting hall. The hall was clean well lit with great clean bathrooms. At the back of the building was a full kitchen and a serving counter in front of that. The LIOINS served breakfast and lunch to the expo goers. One of the nice things was you could order your food and then head back and attend the expo. They used a PA system to call your number when your food was ready. No waiting in lines. They kept the tables clean between customers like any other good restaurant would do. Very nice compared to some events I have tied at.

Around the walls were all kinds of Lion paraphernalia that showed off the club's achievements.
