Fellow Lion

There are several items of information that I want to pass along to you. Regarding Lions International Convention in Las Vegas.

First, I have attached the flyer and registration form for a Midwest Breakfast to be held in Las Vegas on July 2nd. In the past the Midwest Breakfast has been a good place to meet and mingle with Lions from several states during the International Convention and I expect it to be the same this year. The breakfast is pricy, but I encourage you to register if you can and visit with the Lions of Missouri as well as several other states. Note that the due date for registration is June 25 but earlier registration is probably better so that they can adequately prepare

.Second, the decision was made not to have a formal hospitality room for the Missouri Lions in Las Vegas. Please seek out your fellow Missourians during the convention, however, and let's all enjoy each other's company as well as the company of the Lions throughout the world who will be in attendance. We will attempt to locate an area in the plenary sessions where the Missouri Lions can sit together so look for us.

Third, the International Parade will step off early in Las Vegas at 8:30 am. We do not have an assembly time yet, but I will forward that as soon as I know it. The temperatures are expected to be very high so plan accordingly. There are suggestions on the LCI website under LCICON for staying cool. This does NOT mean that the Missouri uniform will be modified for the parade, however, and our parade marshall, PCC Jeff Hilke, has promised to throw out any Missouri Lions who show up wearing anything other than the approved blue parade shirt, black pants, black socks, black shoes and black belt. If you prefer to wear a hat, the approved hat is the white ball cap with the Lions logo that we have sold. There are to be no additions or substitutions to the prescribed uniform.

Fourth, there is an allotment of five pins each for those Lions registered for the convention except for those Lions who have received an allotment based on other criteria. The international convention committee also has on hand a large quantity of 2014 pins and we voted to distribute five each of those pins to attendees as well for trading purposes. I expect to have all the pins in Las Vegas so look me up to get your allotment.







We also want to thank Missouri School for the Blind superintendent, Geoffrey Barney for serving as the Master of Ceremonies for the fourth time. He really keeps thing moving and adds his own special comedy between acts. We especially want to thank the three judges, two of whom were serving for the second time this year. A big thank you to Paul Ehresman who coaches some of the MSB sports teams, to Bryan Lee, who has been into music all his life and played with some local bands, and to Gerald Quinn who served for the first time this year. Judging such a different variety of acts certainly can't be an easy job.

By selling ads in the program, securing great raffle prizes from local merchants and by selling drinks, snacks, etc. at the event, the Maplewood Lions club was able to make a nice profit than can be used for Christmas gifts for students at the Missouri School for the Blind and the Maplewood Secret Santa program, the USO, college scholarships for Maplewood/Richmond Heights students, supporting local food pantries as well as the Leader Dog program and other worthwhile projects.

The Maplewood Lions Club has 13 visually impaired members and claim that we have more than any other Lions club anywhere. The Webster Groves League has > 150 teams with > 1,600 boys and girls participating from pre-K through 8th grade. Lions Norma Belcher, Mary Ulrich, Fred Yoder, Dennis Williams, Greg Hanser, and Rob Halama gathered together to face the hungry herds (yes, there were more than one!) and attempt to quell their hunger and quench their thirst with those perfectly prepared puppies, the cavernous containers of chips, the chocolate chip chunky cookies, and a bounty of bubbling (and non-bubbling) beverages.

They came fast and they came hard, and it took the five of us slaving to keep up with the frenzied pace Lion Mary had set up at the front line. But we did. The grill was churning doggies out as fast as Lions Fred and Dennis could pull them off, and Lions Greg, Norma, and Rob could pluck, load, and wrap.

In the end, they took almost everything. All of the 504 hotdogs, and one box out of 8 cookies remained. None of the 8 cases of chips, and out of over 500 bottles or cans of soda and water, about 50 remained. Even the locusts were amazed.

"SECURITY SYSTEMS DONATION TO WEBSTER GROVES SCHOOL



On Tuesday, April 23rd, the Webster Groves Lions President Sandy Halama and Carnival Chairperson Becky Speeler, presented a check in the amount of \$8,000 to the WGSD Board of Education, for the installation of security systems in the school buildings. These systems will include security locks for doors at the High School, cameras, and other needed security equipment/systems to keep the students safe. For several years, various students and student groups have donated their time to help the WG Lions with the 4th of July Carnival & BBQ and monthly BBQs, without the assistance from these young people, managing these fund-raising events, would be most difficult. The 4th of

July Carnival & BBQ requires on average, 6,000 man-hrs. of effort, all volunteer, and these young people fill a significant part of that effort. For that, the Lions thank them. Additionally, the Lions thank the community for their support and attendance to these events. Without this support the Lions could not make this donation or the many others such as WGSD college scholarships, equipment and materials for the WG Police and Fire Departments, Martha Hilden Fund, etc.


