A Tip from Your Global Membership Chair

Clubs that have their own meeting hall have a tendency to overlook the fact that visitors don't know where to park or possibly even which door to enter. Some meeting locations can be a bit confusing to know where to go once they have entered in the building.

Most clubs have always had a greeter at the door before a club meeting. Generally they are shaking hands, saying hello with a smile. Issue is that they are standing on the inside of the hall entrance. Well beyond the parking and front door in some locations. Some clubs have even given up on any kind of greeter leaving the visitor on their own to find the meeting and a place to sit. So with that said anyone coming to visit the LIONS club for the first time may have a hard time with parking and figuring out the first door to walk thru as a prospective LION. This in itself can speak loudly about a club to a possible member.

Here are some thoughts on these issues. First is the parking. If the club has its own residence could it be possible to designate a parking spot at the door for visitors to the meeting. Members always park as close to the entrance but never think of the visitor that is lost and trying to find their way to the meeting. Making them feel welcome as soon as they hit the parking lot is a huge start in the right direction.

Keep the greeter idea in operation, have them wear the most recognized colors of LIONS the Yellow (Gold) & Blue Hat, and possible a Lions vest. Even if they don't have these items in their personal wardrobe the clubs should keep a set on hand just for the job of the greeter. These colors make this person stand out from all others even if the club is meeting in a restaurant. Try placing the greeter outside by the door of entrance to the meeting 15 minutes before the meeting starts. Any visitor will see them know what door to enter and the greeter could also direct the visitor to the appropriate meeting hall or room. This is a start to making them understand that this club is a thriving club and not just existing. Also, if the member is out in the lobby of the restaurant or on the street they are a walking billboard for that LIONS club to all others that are passing by.

If the club is meeting in a public place such as a restaurant have the greeter stand out in front with the maitre d. I am very sure that the restaurant will not mind if the LIONS help seat their members and take a load of the restaurant's personnel.

Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation

June 20th to 24th the Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation sent seven volunteer technicians and one student doctor to Poza Rica, Mexico to distribute used eyeglasses. The Missouri group joined with three eye doctors and three student doctors from the Lions in Sight of California/Nevada and the local Poza Rica Innovation Lions Club to sponsor the clinic. After a doctor's eye exam the technicians then matched the person's prescription with a pair of glasses. The used eye glasses had been collected in the states by Lions Clubs, cleaned and graded in advance and shipped to the site for the clinic. The local Poza Rica Innovation Lions Club provided translators and arranged for space at a local church. During the two day event 700 children and adults received glasses. Most of these would have never been able to afford glasses and were very grateful and happy to have this opportunity to improve their vision.

Lions, you can help by collecting eyeglasses for future clinics in countries all over the world. Through the Missouri Lions Eye Mission clinics Lions really do change lives by giving the gift of sight.

Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation

Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation became a 501 (c) 3 non-profit foundation chartered by the State of Missouri over two years ago.

Since that time, we've had three mission trips. Our fourth trip will be this September (to Tuxtla Gutierrez , Mexico). These trips have included Lions members, families, and doctors from across the state. On a typical trip with two clinic days, we usually serve approximately 800 people who receive recycled glasses collected by Lions.

We plan to have two trips in 2020. We don't know locations or dates yet. However, it's important for us to have interested participants. Please consider making a trip next year. You won't regret it.

Everyone who has made one of these excursions wants to return. We all have heard the question "When did you become a Lion?" For many of us, it happened when we made our first mission trip. It almost seems that we get more from these trips than the people we serve.

We have four primary goals for the coming year:

- 1) We want to expand our volunteer base to all districts in Missouri.
- 2) We want to have an Eye Mission Foundation Ambassador in each district. This person will promote missions to both Lion volunteers and doctors.
- 3) We want to find doctors who can eventually become lead doctors on Missouri Lion trips. If you have doctors in your clubs, or doctors in your community, please let them know about our mission trips.
- 4) We encourage you to make donations to the foundation or assist us in getting grants. We need these funds for the stipends provided to the doctors. We also hope to purchase our own cameras and doctor bags in the future.

It's neat to know that our International President has a connection to St. Louis.



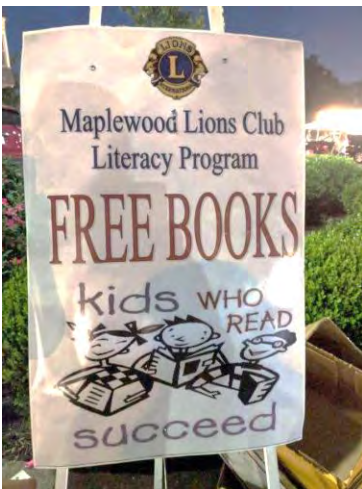


## PROJECT LITERITCY

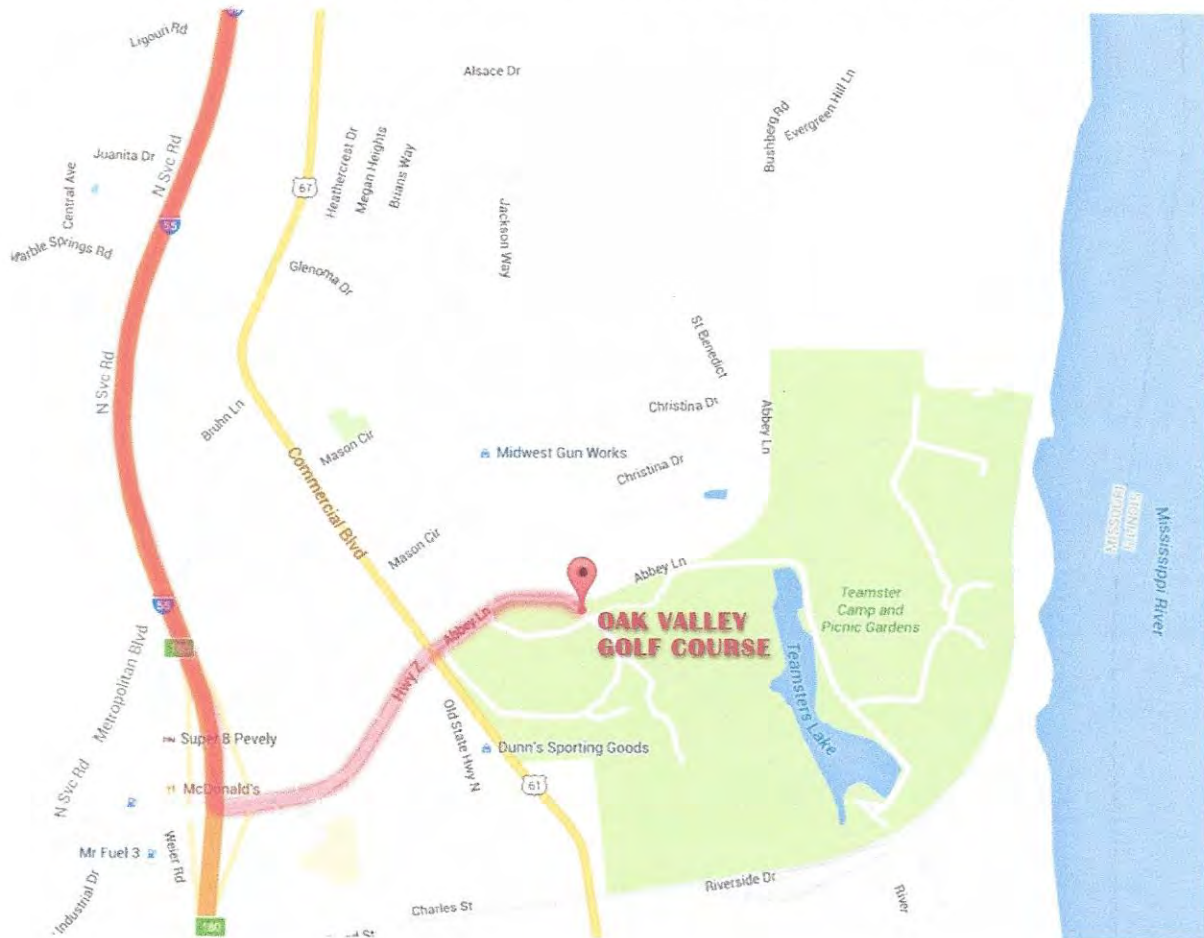
