A Tip from Your Global Membership Chair

When I was young I had my hobby that I really enjoyed. As I became older and entered the work force my adult life got in the way of my hobby. When I settled down in my life I started to have the time and finances to get back into that hobby I loved so much. Well, not many hobbies are fun without others, so I set out to start a club.

How did I go about finding others with the same passion for my hobby you may ask? Well I approached it by advertising to the people that may have my same interest. I thought of where these targeted people would be and I set out to advertise for possible members to my new club. I started by approaching the hobby shop owners to put fliers in their front windows. These would be my HELP WANTED signs. They stated that I was going to be starting a club in this hobby and if interested please contact me. I was successful in starting this club that attained in the neighborhood of 20 members. I found people that I did not know existed with the same interest as I did. Today over thirty five years latter there are still three of us that get together as great friends with solid interest in that hobby.

So, you may be asking why I told that story. It's because LIONS cannot sit back and wait for a new member to walk thru the door. They need to take the initiative as I did then and start looking for people that have the same interest that they have as a Lion.

Lions have to look at perspective members as a business owner would look for those employees that will make the business operate and prosper. With that in mind, a business will not spend time and resources looking where those people are not. As a small LIONS club that may not have much money to spend on advertising this is really important to target those possible members.

The opening for membership really needs to be described for that member to understand what it is they are joining. What would be the description for that lion in your club? Is the club just looking for bodies to fill a meeting room? Will that person be asked to work certain fundraisers? And most of all will that person be able to help the causes that they are most interested in helping. Remember that they want to know what is in it for them. I know you will say that it's that warm feeling you get when helping others but they need to know what is in it for them now, as soon as they join. Then they will learn to get that warm fuzzy feeling later from helping others. The great feeling of helping others will keep them in the club.

After creating a job description of what the Lion would be, then it is time to start advertising. Think about where you would look for a job in your field today and apply that to where you would advertise for that Lion. Would you look in the newspaper or some other place for that job? Maybe, but today there are so many places on the internet for employers to post the job openings that can be effective. Lions clubs should use the internet to place the help wanted sign.

The idea here is to advertise for members and do it where it can be seen by others that possibly have the same interest as LIONS. Some of the places that come to mind are church bulletins, school bulletins, local newspapers and the already mentioned fliers posted in the view of the public. Local newspapers are always in need of fill articles to keep on file when needed. Write up a short article for them about your clubs need for new members. Face book and other internet media are out there to be taken advantage of for free. Almost all small communities have some kind of Face book page to stay connected are a community web site. In the Webster-Shrewsbury cities there is a Face book page set up called Webster Connect. The Webster Lions club posted on that page their help wanted poster; The Webster Groves Lions are in need of a few new members. The Webster Groves Lions club is made up of a few good men and women of all ages coming together to do one thing, and that is to help the community of Webster Groves. If you think that you may be interested in becoming one of the folks that helps their community and want more information on becoming a lion, please go to our website webstergroveslions.org. Are come to one of our monthly barbecues and speak directly to a Lion.

Club members liked that post so much that they are now sharing it with their connections and have suggested making a poster to put up at all their functions.

The idea is that there are future LIONS members out there that may not even know that there is an active Lions club in their community that is looking for new members. Never assume that everyone knows that there is a Lions club in their community and most of all looking for new members. There are so many places and ways to advertise for a new lion that there is no reason not to.

If you like some of my ideas of how to go about new members please invite Lion Vicky and me to come speak to your club membership at a meeting or we can come to a zone meeting.

New Voices Spotlights!

New Voices Spotlight for November

Hello from New Voices!

As I mentioned last month, LCI changed the focus for the New Voices program to include young adults and other underrepresented populations. The November Spotlight highlights one of our



newest district members and his sponsor. To hear Lion **Asher Mitchell**'s story is exciting and encouraging as we think about bringing new members to our clubs. And of course, his sponsor, Lion **Kimberly Taylor** has a story to tell of her own!



Here is the November New Voices Spotlight – Lions Asher Mitchell and his sponsor Kimberly Taylor (who has held

almost all positions, the highest being Past Council Chairperson for MD26!)

What made you join Lions?

Lion Asher:

I'm a Mississippi native and began my association with the Lions Club in 2012; through the Mississippi Lions All-State Band. The band, composed of high school students from across the state, represents the Lions of Mississippi in the "Parade of Nations" at the international convention almost every year, and they've taken home the 1st place title every year in which they've competed since 2003. It's a truly remarkable group. I had no knowledge of what the Lions Club was; as a saxophonist, I just wanted to be in that band. I earned a spot in the band in 2012 and again in 2013. The band chose not to attend the convention in South Korea in 2012 (opting instead to participate in a parade in Honolulu, Hawaii), but we took home an international title again in Germany the next year. Both years gave me the two best summers of my life so far, and I'm extraordinarily grateful for the opportunity.

Since 2013, I intended to get involve with the Lions Club, learn more about its mission, and give back a little bit of the generosity it gave me. Having lived in a rural Mississippi town of 200 people with no Lions Club chapter around, I waited until I moved to St. Louis for law school to find a chapter in which I could get involved. The Brentwood Lions have been an incredibly welcoming and hospitable group, and I am so glad I joined.

Lion Kimberly:

I was a friend of the Brentwood Lions, working at their events, inspired by the work and wanted to be recognized as a Lion.

EDITOR'S NOTE: When interviewing Lions Asher and Kimberly, I asked what the Brentwood Lions did, to not only install Lion Asher, but keep him enthusiastic. Oftentimes, clubs can get new members to join, but they don't necessarily stay in the club. The answer was eye opening, although not unexpected. The timing of Lion Asher's installation was perfect. The club was able to immediately give him a job with their upcoming Trivia event as well as have him involved in an eye wrap event. Had he not gotten involved right away, he may not have found the purpose he was looking for and gone elsewhere.

Lion Kimberly:

In my opinion, getting new members involved immediately helps them gain a purpose and feel like part of the club sooner rather than later.

What project(s) or event(s) stand out as making you proud to be a Lions?

Lion Asher:

Being a freshly minted member, I have only participated in organizing one project so far (the Brentwood Lions trivia night in October), and I can't claim to have contributed much. But it was a great experience to meet other Lions in the district, and I look forward to many more meaningful experiences and opportunities to fundraise and serve.

Lion Kimberly:

I think my most proud moments are when I've been on eye mission trips. Seeing patients that are seeing clearly again because of our donated glasses and our work, makes me proud of what we do as Lions.

What challenges do you/have you faced as a younger person/woman/minority in Lions?

Lion Asher:

A great thing about the Brentwood Lions is that they were incredibly welcoming of me. As a twenty-five-year old, there's an obvious discrepancy between my age and the median age of your typical chapter's membership, but this chapter took my interest as seriously as I intended to show it. I'm certain that any issues with retaining younger members is not a result of poor reception of those members into the club.

Lion Kimberly:

When I joined Lions, there were many young people and women already in Lions. So I had a lot of people to look up to and follow, including my husband, Eugene.

What inspires and excites you most to keep serving?

Lion Asher:

I honestly just feel blessed beyond belief. Coming from a rural, poverty-stricken part of the Deep South, I have received opportunities through education and music that folks where I come from don't typically receive. I feel like that gives me a personal obligation to serve others in some capacity.

Lion Kimberly:

Almost all of my friends are Lions, so I get to hang out and work while serving with friends.

What advice do you have for young adults or those of other diverse backgrounds thinking about joining Lions?

Lion Asher:

While I can't speak for anyone but myself, I imagine if you ask young folks whether they intend to get involved in service at some point in their lives, most of them would reply enthusiastically positively. The more interesting question is "When?" This is understandably more difficult: young folks are busy setting up their careers, establishing personal relationships, and sweating all kinds of small stuff. I think young folks too often think of service as something to do after settling down. This might be a tempting reason to hold off, but consider going to a meeting anyway. I'm confident that most young folks interested in Lions would find it contributes much more to their lives, and others' lives, than it detracts from their time.

Lion Kimberly:

Join! We are getting more/different people in our organization!

What one thing would you change to give others "their voice"?

Lion Asher:

I want everyone who is a Lion, thinking about becoming a Lion, or has no idea what the Lions Club is or does, to know this is an organization for you, and every diverse background and unique perspective only enhances the work we do.

Lion Kimberly:

Listen more!!! Everyone has a voice, but sometimes they are afraid to speak. Keep listening!

Any other thoughts?

Lion Asher:

I'm grateful to be one of the district's newest members, and I plan on continuing service with the Lions wherever I may find myself in the years to come. Bob Dylan rolled through St. Louis in

October, and I'm reminded of a lyric of his: "All you can do is do what you must. You do what you must do and you do it well."

Although Lion Gina was challenged from the start by a club that would not allow women to join, her desire to be a Lion persevered, and we are grateful these 20 years later!

"My husband Terry (PCC) was a Lion in District 26-J (Owensville). I worked with him at several events and wanted to join. Unfortunately, at that time Owensville LIONS did not accept women. Terry sponsored me into the Gerald LIONS Club and transferred once the fiscal year ended in 1999."

When asked about a stand-out project, Gina tells the story that is one we all hope to experience, because it highlights the wonderful work of LIONS. As incoming President, Lion Gina attended a Mid-South LIONS Sight & Hearing Service for LIONS Leaders Weekend.

"The tour of the facility was remarkable. PCC Terry and I went to a quarterly meeting in Memphis at Methodist Hospital and PDG Bud Dean asked Terry to serve on the finance committee. We were hooked! This organization helps the four state area (Arkansas, Mississippi, Missouri and Western Tennessee). At one of the quarterly meetings I met one of our patients. Her name was Marissa. When she was a younger she was bitten by a dog. She lost her eye and it left her with a horrible scar. One day her teacher asked her what she wanted to be when she grew up and she said I want to be pretty. Now if that doesn't make you feel horrible. Mid-South was contacted and we were able to provide her with a prosthetic eye and corrective surgery for her eye socket and forehead. I had tears running down my face when she spoke and told us "thank you for making me pretty". That's when I knew I was doing the right thing!"

In addition to her early challenge with joining a club, LION Gina describes the personal challenges which LIONS have helped to overcome.

"My challenges have been, I was a very shy and quiet person. I hated to be picked to speak at school, I sat in the back of the room and tried to be a shadow. When I started getting involved with my club and the district giving reports, I would stutter and shake. As time went by it got a little easier. I still have some fears especially in front of a lot of people. But going through the steps to be District Governor, allowed me to break personal barriers pushing myself to speak to large groups. Being short you're always teased to stand up, now I can laugh with them."

As LIONS we strive to find that "button" that continues to inspire us to keep serving. Lion Gina found her inspiration in young girl.

"Those Marissa's out there. The ones who are less fortunate than ourselves. Every time I hear stories about children or adults who can't see. We perform surgery to help them and they come back to a meeting and tell us that we are the best thing in their lives."

What advice does Lion Gina have for young adults, or those of other diverse backgrounds, either who are currently LIONS and may need a little extra inspiration, or those thinking about joining LIONS?

"My advice is get involved, find a mentor, ask questions, no question is stupid. We think everyone knows what we know. But that's not true. I'm horrible about not informing LIONS about what I'm doing, or what needs to be done. If you don't like what you are doing, and prefer to do something else, talk to someone. The worse thing that can happen to those we serve, is for a Lion to quit."

Lastly, the one thing Lion Gina suggest to help give others "their voice" is "From the top down, we need servant leaders instead of authoritarians. We are all here, as volunteers, to serve others and we need the same from our leadership. No hidden agendas, no personal gain, simply, what can I do for you? This allows "their voice" to be heard, if no one listens, there is no reason to speak."

I'm sure you will all join me when I say both our November and December spotlights are inspirational and motivating. If we all take one thought from these stories, it should be as a LION, no matter the position, we should do more listening, mentoring, and involving of ALL LIONS, not just new members. I think I will end this article with Lion Gina's words, which for me define New Voices...

"If no one listens, there is no reason to speak."




