

New Voices Spotlight

Our first New Voice Spotlight for 2021 has been a Lion for 15 years. In addition to serving in many positions in her Club from Tail Twister to President, she has left her mark at District level as well, holding positions as Zone Chair, Eye Foundation Board member, State Band Chair, District Convention Committee, and Global Action Team Service Coordinator. Most recently you know her as the driving force behind the District service projects, insuring, even during a Pandemic, those less fortunate get some much needed help.



Lion Teddi Speeler of the Webster Groves LIONS Club started her journey when her son and daughter were in high school, and in a place many Lions like to gather, a bowling alley!

"I bowled at Crestwood bowl on Monday nights, the bowling alley was split between a women's league and the Lions league. My kids were active with sports and their youth groups and they always had a fundraiser going on, or were selling cookies or candy bars for school. The Lions were always so kind in participating in whatever they were doing, pledging for the 30hr famine, or buying the raffle tickets. One night I asked Lion Scott Young how I could repay such kindness they had shown my children and his response was come volunteer. They had a BBQ that weekend, so I came and volunteered my time. I enjoyed it so much that I came back the next day. I started attending meetings and even brought my daughter and then I joined the club. I was

hooked and I loved it. I quickly came to realize that LIONS was so much more than volunteering and raising money for charity, its being a part of a worldwide organizations that's main goal is to help the less fortunate. "

Lion Teddi has held many positions, and has led or helped on numerous fundraisers and service projects. Closest to her are those projects that support children, from leading the District Pediatric Comfort Bag Project and Food Drive to supporting her own club's events, Pancakes with Santa, Easter Egg Hunt, and Peace Poster Contest. "Knowing that the kids receiving the comfort bags are struggling and we can bring a smile or a moment of happiness to their bad day fills my heart. With the District Food Drive we supported area food banks; we helped with the backpack program at Affton School District providing meals for students over the weekend when food at home is scarce. The Peace Poster Contest has been a passion of mine for years; this is a great way to introduce Lions to our youth and their families. Pancakes with Santa is another project that brings so much joy to the children and families. Watching them get so excited to see Santa makes me feel like a child again, I love that so many of our clubs in our District host an event like this. The Easter Egg hunt is another fun project that is near and dear to my heart. I love watching the kids hunt for the eggs and seeing their big grins when sitting on the Easter Bunnies lap. All of these events are a great way to give back to the community."

Continuing as a Lion, while staying inspired and enthusiastic, has been a challenge for many Lions this past year. Digging deep inside to find that which excites a person is more important than ever. Fortunately for LION Teddi, she has found her inner spirit that pushes her to continue. It is all about the people and faces. "I think seeing someone's face after they have been helped by the LIONS is truly the most rewarding part. It makes those long hours at BBQs worth it, or the long hours spent stuffing Easter Eggs, or the long hours prepping for events worth every minute and hour spent."

Everyone has a challenge to overcome, some bigger than others. Lion Teddi is no different, and she faced a challenge many people face as LIONS but don't really think about it when they join. Speaking in front of an audience. Whether a small group like a committee or Club or a large audience such as a convention, to some this is a major obstacle. Lion Teddi has a few words to share.

"I would say that my biggest challenge in LIONS has been public speaking. I never had much experience speaking publicly until I joined the Lions. Whether it was reading meeting minutes, or giving a report at a cabinet meeting or convention. I have steadily progressed in my public speaking. Knowing that I have the support of all those Lions in the room makes it that much easier to do."


As we all have heard, membership is hurting. New members, new voices, are needed to keep our District strong. Lion Teddi has successfully brought new members into LIONS in the past, and has some words of wisdom to share when talking to prospective members, or even members who need a little push. "Take the leap and give it a try. You don't know what you're missing. If you try a club and aren't excited or engaged try another club, the right club is out there for you."

"Lions have been the best kept secret for years and it's time to change that. For those struggling to light the fire again we still need you! We have work to do and people to help. Try coming up with a fun idea or something out of the box. We need creative thinkers. To those we have lost but are considering membership again please come back! We need you as well. We have a membership that is growing older and need any and everybody that we could have."

In a year that kindness and inclusion are more important than ever, as LIONS we need to think about ensuring all of our members have the ability and tools to be heard. "I would say courage. I would like to give other women, young people or minorities the courage to speak up within your club, or the courage to reach out to a Lion to ask for information about joining or the courage to ask other clubs for help. We're all in this together if this past year has taught us anything. We all have to support each other. Kindness cost nothing and does so much to help other people. Always be kind, you never know what someone else is going through. "

"My favorite part about LIONS is helping people and doing Service Projects. I believe that service projects are just important as fundraising. Knowing what my club, district and state does to help those in need inspires me to keep going and to keep putting in those long hours because LIONS is so much more than just 1 individual. It's a group of us coming together for the common goal to help those in need."

PCC Joe and Lion Michelle Foster started their journey in LIONS roughly 15 years ago. At the time, since their young sons' Cub/Boy Scout meetings were held at the Beaufort LIONS Club facility, Joe and Michelle were in the building once or twice a week. Having noticed the Lions, Joe asked the question "What do Lions do?"

Realizing, as many with young children do, they spent a lot of time with their boys, but did not have much interaction with other adults.

That is when the adventure began...

PCC Joe joined the Beaufort LIONS Club in 2005. He was so drawn into his Club and LIONS, that in a short time, he held an impressive list of positions, from Club level, to District and State; Club Vice President, President, Board Member, Boy Scout Liaison, District/State positions of Zone Chair, Region Chair, Global Leadership Chair (GLT), Vice Governor, District Governor (15/16, 17/18), Council Chair (16/17), and Band Committee.

Lion Michelle decided to join shortly after, in 2006. As another dedicated Lion, she too has held many positions at the Club and District level; Club Secretary, Vice President, President, and Membership Chair, as well as District Public Relations, Alert, State Athletic, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, and as Spouse of PCC Joe.

Although, in the beginning, PCC Joe was satisfied to serve within his Club's area, once they started venturing out, their adventure truly began. "Once Joe decided that it was ok to leave our zip

code, our eyes were opened wide. Our favorite part about being a lion is the friendships we have made around the World, and the places we have gotten to experience because of Lions. Because of these friendships from Past Council Chairs and Past District Governors and just plain Lions we are inspired to continue serving to hopefully make a difference in someone's life, whether it be donating eyeglass, giving food, or shelter."

In their Lionistic years, the Fosters have been part of many activities and events. Some events stand out with memories that instill the warmth and satisfaction all Lions cherish. "Participating in things such as the Downtown St. Pat's Day Parade has been an event that has warmed our hearts to hear people yell out "Thank You lions for giving my child glasses to see better or eye surgery", or "hey my Son played football on the Lions Football team and it was one of the best weeks of their life". Operation Food Search was another heartwarming service project."

To be as involved in LIONS as the Fosters, each person must find the Club that shares their interests and passions. As we think about increasing membership, and often wonder what are the right words to encourage a person to consider joining LIONS, PCC Joe and Lion Michelle have these thoughts for inspiration. "When looking to join Lions or any other service organization, look into it first and make sure that it fits your needs. Reach out and visit multiple clubs and find the one where you fit best. Travel outside your zip code and experience what Lions truly can do and bring it back to your Community."

Correct Operating Procedures for this year for processing requests. The Correct Operating Procedure is noted as follows:

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website https://lions26m2.org/resources.html for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- 7. The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
 - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
 - a. Assigned
 - b. In progress
 - c. Forwarded
 - d. Closed (Complete)
- 9. If <u>ANY</u> Lions club receives an independent request <u>OUTSIDE</u> of the LAS line, please contact the LAS chair with the following information.
 - a. Date received
 - b. Requestors Name
 - c. ZIP CODE
 - d. Club Name assisting
 - e. Date of completion



So, it seems in our best interest to reschedule the Convention to April 9th through April 11th, 2021.

We will still hold all activities at the DoubleTree Westport and are anxious to see everyone again. Come re-energize with the Lions of District 26-M2!

The <u>Friday night Hospitality</u> will be held in the Grand Ballroom. We are <u>ANTICIPATING</u> being able to accommodate as many Clubs' hospitality booths in one large area, as we have in past years, including entertainment and a dance floor. <u>HOWEVER</u>, in these days of unknowns and social distancing, the Committee needs to be prepared to possibly have fewer booths than normal, based on local guidelines and hotel requirements. 
