

District 26-M2 Governor Leon's Message

Fellow Lions,

Nine and a half months ago my ribbon was pulled at the Lions International convention in Montreal, and I officially became governor of our great District 26-M2. I remember thinking sure, I looked at all the meetings, the things I wanted to do and thought no way will it be either. Boy was I wrong.

Yes, there have been a lot of meetings. Club visits where I met Lions that are excited about serving others and heard new ideas of ways to help in their community. I heard of unique fund raisers and was fortunate enough to install many new members.

Attending other district's conventions and meeting International Directors and Past Directors was exciting and I made friends with Lions I would never have met if not becoming governor. Every weekend beginning with February up until May has or will involve Lions with a break for the Masters and Easter and yes, my wife was not too happy about that but I wouldn't trade it for anything. Time has flown by but it has been an awesome experience.

My goals were and continue to be to make Lions fun and rewarding to members. I wanted to add a learning experience to cabinet meetings by bringing in speakers to tell us about their passions. I think that has made our cabinet meetings more interesting and informative.

I wanted to gain at least one in our membership total for the district. We aren't quite there yet although we have been up as high as three for a short period. We still have time to reach a positive number in our district and in the Constitutional Area. SLU Campus Club will either be a new club or a branch club since LCI has denied our request to reactivate because of the fifteen-month lapse. We are meeting with them via zoom as this newsletter is being sent out and will have a determination before the end of April. Missouri School for the Blind and a new visually impaired club are still a possibility but will probably not happen until Lion Carr's year as governor.

Donations to LCIF have not reached last year's levels as of this writing but I hope we will make up this deficit before July 1. We all know there seems to be more natural disasters than ever where LCIF is helping. Matching grants, many in our own state, have helped build all abilities parks and furnished freezers for food pantries and enabled many clubs to help others with funds through LCIF. We know the funds are definitely needed and put to good use. Paton Lions are helping with the tornado that hit the Grassy, Glen Allen area costing five lives and much damage. LCIF is on the ground as well. See the flyer in this newsletter for a possible way to add your LCIF donation.

We have not been successful in collaborating with Special Olympics as I had hoped. We do have an event April 29th in Chesterfield that Lion IPDG Devin has coordinated that can be a start. Miracle League baseball buddies with the YMCA is for those who are handicapped. If you aren't already signed up come out and help.

Vision has always been my passion and on that front, we have definitely made progress. Lion Berger and "Team New Haven" have screened a tremendous number of children and have trained several additional volunteers. The Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation fielded a team of seven Missouri Lions on a trip to Morelia, Mexico giving 730 people vision through recycled eye glasses. The first US mission was held in November in Soulard fitting 30 homeless people with recycled eyeglasses and a second mission is scheduled for May 13. We have missions scheduled in Mexico, Missouri, Kansas City, St. Roberts, and Springfield along with possibilities in several other areas in the state and maybe Kansas and Illinois. We also have openings for volunteers to Mexico in June and Panama this September. Lion IPDG Devin or I will be happy to give you more information. I am excited to be able to bring vision to others with our recycled eye glasses and hope you are too.

District 26–M2 Cabinet Meeting Minutes April 3, 2023 Timbers of Eureka

Call To Order at 6:30 p.m. by District Governor-Elect Paul Carr. This is a regularly scheduled cabinet meeting.

Pledge was led by PDG Sandee Marshall.

Song was led by 1st VDG-Elect Michelle Foster.

Prayer was led by DGE Paul Carr.

Introduction of First Time Attendees/Guests: Lion Monica Lawrence (Union), speaker

Appointment of Tail Twister: Motion by 1st VDG-Elect Michelle Foster to appoint Lion Sandy Halama (Webster Groves) as the Tail Twister; second by Lion Teddi Speeler. Motion passed. Motion by IPDG Devin Struttmann to donate proceeds Mid South Sight and Hearing; second by PDG Sandee Marshall. Motion passed.

6:35 p.m. Adjourn for Dinner—Reconvene at 7:15 p.m

Secretary's Report: PDG Sandee Marshall reported that the minutes of the December 5, 2022 Cabinet Meeting had been distributed and were also sent with the meeting notice. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by 1st VDG-Elect Michelle Foster to accept the minutes as presented; second by Lion Dennis Hemsath. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Lion Dennis Hemsath reported a balance of \$35,034.51 in the Service Activity account and \$57,329.32 in the Administrative account. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by Lion Karen Skornia to accept the report as presented; second by Lion Geoff Meese. Motion passed. **Governor's Opening Remarks:** DGE Paul Carr referred to the meeting as a family dinner with hopes of having dinner table-like conversation. He also encouraged everyone to recommend guest speakers for next year.

Guest Speaker: Lion Monica Lawrence is in charge of CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) in Franklin County. As a foster parent, she saw the need for a trained volunteer to develop a personal relationship with each child and become their advocate in court. Currently, she supervises 113 volunteers who are representing 150 children. They are always looking for compassionate adults to volunteer about 10 to 12 hours a month.

District Goals: DGE Paul Carr started a discussion of District goals for next year by stating his intent to raise the service reporting percentage by 30%. One incentive suggested was a free registration to a Lions event. It was noted that any service performed by a Lion outside of Lions can be entered by secretaries, service chairs and club administrators. It was mentioned that many struggle with the MyLion system but no one is asking for help.

Training: DGE Paul Carr announced the dates for upcoming club officer training. May 31st and June 1st will be Zoom trainings; times to be announced later. Two trainings will be held at The Timbers on June 8th, 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., and June 11th, 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. The curriculum will be sent ahead. Retiring officers should encourage new officers to attend.

Changes to LCI and LCIF: DGE Carr shared a PowerPoint presentation called "Get Ready for the New Lions Experience" which will launch sometime after the International Convention. Lions should prepare by checking their information currently on file, especially ensuring an unshared email address. Officers for the new Lions year must be entered by May 15th.

Old Business: DGE Carr explained the advantages of completing the requirements for the Quality Lion award.

MO Eye Mission Foundation: IPDG Devin Struttmann reported on the success of the first eye mission in 3 years; 630 patients were served in Morelia, Mexico. Additional missions are available to Mexico in June and Panama in September. An in-state mission will happen in Mexico, MO on April 30th. The foundation has been asked to apply for a SavingSight grant.

MD26 Athletic Committee: IPDG Devin Struttmann reported on the updated state athletic committee. There will no longer be a football game; the focus will be on all-ability sports. Miracle League Baseball is looking for 25 volunteers to be "buddies" at the event in Chesterfield on April 29th. The committee is selling a limited amount (210) of tickets for a meat raffle for \$25 each.

LCIF: IPDG Devin Struttmann asked for ideas for grant proposals. He can tell anyone the amount of funds on an individual or club account.

District Eye Wrap: IPDG Devin Struttmann reminded everyone of the annual eye wrap to be held on May 6th at Wildwood Community Park. Copy paper boxes are needed.

St. Louis University Lions Club: IPDG Devin Struttmann reported that our request to reactivate the original charter has been rejected again. We will need to charter a new club or branch.

GST: (Read by PDG Sandee Marshall) Lion Pam Manuel reported that there are still Saturday shifts available to pack food for Feed The Need St. Louis, our April service project. Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation April 2023

Your Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation has been busy. After a period of inactivity, we're thrilled and grateful to have much to report.

First, we accomplished our first international mission in March. We had seven Lions from Missouri go to Morelia, a beautiful city in the country of Mexico. We joined with four doctors from different parts of the U.S. and Canada, added a Past International Director from California, and made a great team. We had two days of clinic and served 630 people. I want to personally thank these Lions who joined me on this trip: Lion Ed Marshall, Lion Missy Maune, Lion Bob Noellsch, Lion Mary Jane Noellsch, Lion Mike Oldelehr, and Lion Pat Porterfield. I could not imagine a better group.

Next, we're trying to recruit volunteers for two upcoming International mission trips. We have a four-day trip going to Mexico on June 1-4. We then have a week-long trip going to Panama on September 9-17.

We often hear how much you desire to go on one of our mission trips. Well, now is the time to sign up. We haven't had much interest in these trips yet and we would be disappointed if we couldn't put together a roster. Please reach out to me, or anyone on the board, and we will cover the details.

Here are some of the most common details we get asked about:

- Volunteers are responsible for their airfare and personal expenses. Food and lodging will be covered.

- The duties of the technicians include working the cameras or matching prescriptions to the appropriate glasses. For those inexperienced, you will receive information prior to the trip and training at the clinic. You do not need previous experience.

- You will need a passport.

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website <u>https://lions26m2.org/resources.html</u> for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
 - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
