We only need a net of 1 new Lion a week to meet the goal of 1200 Lions. Congratulations to the Eureka, House Springs, St. Louis Downtown and Washington Lions Clubs for adding new members in July. Members may be lost because they did not find a way to serve that fulfilled their passion. Think outside the box! Perhaps we can organize a North County eye mission and/or diabetes screening in league with the Ferguson or Overland Lions. This will also increase our visibility in the community. GLT Chair: PCC Al Blumenberg reminded us that the purpose of the Global Action Team is to help the District achieve its goals in the areas of leadership, membership and service. Discussion at the July 11th meeting included how to achieve positive membership growth, increased service reporting, support for LCIF, holding training for officers and Zone Chairs and developing actionable plans for each topic.

GST Chair: Lion Pam Manuel loves everything about service and prays we can plan some exciting projects that everyone will be passionate about. A project per month is being planned. The July project at Creve Coeur lake had to be cancelled because of flooding. Operation Clean Stream is the August project, either on the 27th or another date in your area. There are several ways to serve on the ground, in the kitchen or in the water. September may be a trip to Fairmont Park with 50/50s to benefit Longmeadow Rescue Ranch. Committee Reports called by DG Leon Hove (Washington):

Minds Eye: Minds Eye and Lighthouse for the Blind have been chosen to co-host the World Series of Beep Baseball in July 2024 in St. Louis and St. Charles County! This is the first time that organizations, not a city, have been chosen to host. There will be at least 28 teams with at least 8 player each. This is a huge undertaking. I am serving on the planning committee and will be contacting every club for help.

LBOMB: PCC George Winkeler, Jr. (House Springs): COVID-19 shut down many facilities and left product spoiling for 1½ years. Due to working from home, many cafeterias will be replaced with mini markets. A 5-year contract was finally signed with Fort Leonard Wood although the meal count is down. You can help LBOMB by supporting and promoting roadside purchases, making donations to secure matching grants and recommending a location for a new vending machine or other service. LBOMB is currently training 3 new managers in the Kansa City area.

Saving Sight: PCC George Winkeler, Jr. (House Springs): Eye banking operations have provided tissue for 2,719 in our service area and processed 11,048 orders for vital tears. The Charitable Grant Program made three cash grants: \$10,000 to Mid-South, \$15,000 to District 26-M7 Eyeglass Recycling program for new equipment and \$35,000 to KidSight (in addition to gifted office space and operational assistance.) Volunteers can participate in an organ and tissue donation drive at local Walgreen's on 8/27. The September 23rd Board meeting will be held in St. Louis. Mid-South Sight and Hearing: Lion Jennifer Winkeler (House Springs): The 80th anniversary celebration kicked off a campaign to raise \$80,000 to apply for an LCIF matching grant to purchase equipment for the surgery center. The Cataract-a-thon on June 4th restored the sight of 24 patients. There was no cost to the patient (ever) or Mid-South through the generosity of about 60 health care professionals, corporate donations, the Hamilton Eye Institute Lions Club and volunteers. We will again host the Fun Zone at the Cooper Young Festival (9/17). This is an opportunity to give service and also get a lot of PR and, possibly, start a new Lions club. The annual Online Give the Gifts Auction will run from October 21st through November 3rd. You can become a Champion of Mid-South by pledging a minimum of \$10 per month. See the website for more information and upcoming activities.

Youth: Lion Toni Mahoney (Hillsboro): No Leo news. Eight clubs purchased Peace Poster Kits through the District to save postage; other clubs may have purchased separately. Youth Camp was a success with 5 youths attending. Lion Marie Mueller and Cheyenne Porterfield (M3) helped at camp Brimshire. Many thanks to the host families: Lions Mickey and Martha Beach (M5), Lions Mark and Judy Schaeperkoetter (M7), Jim and Chrissy Smith, Lion Pam Manuel (Pacific) and myself. Several Lions Clubs hosted us for a meal or activity as the youths learned about Lions. Thank you to the Overland Lions for hosting the meet and greet finale. PID Don Noland, CC Phyllis Krebs and DG Leon Hove attended along with some of our great Lions.

We demonstrated the use of the SPOT CAMERA and how it functions and the results of readings for possible early eye issues that a child may have. Parents may not know that their child has a issue which may require future professional follow-up. Eighty (80) percent of learning is visual. This was held at Camp Brim Shire in St. James, Mo.

Brooks Story:

"What do you want to be when you grow up?"

"A RACE CAR DRIVER!!" Brooks proudly exclaimed at his Pre-K graduation. I can remember that day like it was just yesterday. It was filled with such hope and promise of a future for him. However, it ended up being one of the last days we ever dreamt about his future together and the last day he would ever feel like a normal student. Just one short month later, our lives forever changed.

Our son, <u>Brooks Blackmore</u>, was a healthy, active and loving 5 year-old boy until June 13, 2015 when we experienced **every parent's worst nightmare. Brooks was unexpectedly diagnosed with two, stage IV inoperable brain tumors** (anaplastic <u>astrocytomas</u>, often referred to as GBMs). We were told there was no cure or any effective treatment options. He received a shunt and tumor biopsy on 6/14/15 and then suffered a brain bleed 10 days later because the tumor was growing so quickly. Brooks immediately started brain radiation in hopes to slow down his tumor and prolong his life. He endured 6 weeks of radiation along with oral chemo. The nasty tumors started to shrink. It was a miracle! After losing almost all motor function, speech, and feeding abilities, Brooks started to improve! With therapy and hard work he regained almost all lost function and was finally able to attend kindergarten part-time. He still had several deficits and struggles as a result of the tumors and treatments, but we felt in our hearts he was going to beat the odds. Throughout his battle Brooks was so brave and did everything he was asked to do. But unfortunately on March 16, 2016, a new tumor was found on his cervical spine. This time the tumor was too aggressive and resistant to radiation. Our hearts were shattered when Brooks gained his angel wings on May 21, 2016. Brooks has forever changed our lives and we are so blessed to have loved him even for 6 short years. We would do it all again, just to call him our son.

Brooks's love for life and his family (especially his younger brother and sister who are twins) radiated throughout his battle with brain cancer. He fought with such bravery and with a "faith over fear" attitude. He was BRAVE beyond his years and one could not help but be inspired. He never gave up. We now take his bravery, faith, and love with us as we face adversity and try to find our way in this lifetime without him.

The "Be Brooks Brave" High Grade Glioma Research Fund was created in honor of our brave boy and in hopes to find a cure for this nasty disease. Pediatric cancer only receives 4% of the U.S. Government funding for cancer research, with brain tumor research only receiving 1%. We heard words like, "there is no cure" and "there are no effective treatment options". The only choice was radiation in hopes to "prolong his life". We are now dedicated to changing this outcome and pray this money makes the difference in helping future families faced with the same devastating news.


