## **District 26-M2 Governor Leon's Message**

## Fellow Lions,

The International Convention in Boston is less than a month from now. Just one short year ago I was looking forward to Montreal and the final bit of coaching and having my ribbon pulled. Boston will be more relaxing for me, and I'm looking forward to being able to enjoy the convention as a PDG instead of a DGE.

Several of the DGs from my group 19 training class are going to be in Boston, including a couple from overseas, so it will be good to renew friendships and catch up on how everyone's year as governor went. The endorsed candidate for 3rd Vice President, Mark Lyon, was our trainer, and I will be attending receptions for him and hearing about his plans for Lions in the future.

I will still be active with the state as a member of the Constitution and Bylaws committee and the Investment committee and will continue to attend district clubs and events as invitations and time permit.

Training and conveying knowledge about Lions activities and service were two things I tried to accomplish and, even though I think we improved in some areas, I'm not satisfied that we did our best. I hope Lion DG Paul and his team can continue and improve on some of the ideas we tried or started.

Special Olympics is one that I hope will eventually become a regular part of our service activities and, if they get their St Louis office running again, that might happen.

Membership in the district is even for the year as I write this. I'm still hoping we can achieve at least a one-member increase before July 1. I am very excited that the majority of our thirty-seven clubs are eligible for a Club Excellence award with either an increase in membership or at least no net losses. SLU still isn't a separate club yet, and we still haven't cracked the ice at the Missouri School for the Blind with a club and possibly a Leo club, but the groundwork has been laid and the future looks promising in those cases. St. Louis downtown is in trouble, and we can not lose that charter club. We need to solicit businesses in St. Louis to have at least one of their employees join and support St. Louis downtown Lions. Think what a great place it would be to meet at Cardinals Ballpark Village. That in itself should be a selling point. If you have contacts or ideas on how to help, contact me, Lion Paul, Lion Michelle or one of the GAT members.

Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation is actively distributing recycled eyeglasses in Missouri. We have had two missions in Soulard, one in Mexico, Missouri and will have one in Kansas City August 12. We have partnered with the St. Louis Archdiocese rural clinics on one visit in St. Clair and have an open invitation to return there or to one of their other sites when our time permits. Springfield is planning a mission this fall, and we hope to have another one somewhere in the St. Louis area this fall as well. There are still spots open for volunteers to Panama In September. Contact myself or Lion PDG Devin for more information.

I'm thankful for all the support and help you the Lions of the best district in the state of Missouri have given me this past year. I wish I could have accomplished more and will continue to help where I can as long as I can. I look forward to supporting DGE Paul as he embarks on his year as governor in any way I can and attending some of your club meetings as time permits and enjoying the fellowship you have extended me this year.

Motion by Lion Pam Manuel to donate proceeds to the PDG Joe Detter Memorial Walk for Diabetes Awareness sponsored by the Rock Community Lions Club: second by PDG Sandee Marshall. Motion passed.

**Secretary's Report**: PDG Sandee Marshall reported that the minutes of the April 3, 2023 Cabinet Meeting had been distributed and were also sent with the meeting notice. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by Lion Pam Manuel to accept the minutes as presented; second by DG-Elect Paul Carr. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Lion Dennis Hemsath reported a balance of \$31,894.09 in the Service Activity account and \$56,271.02 in the Administrative account. No corrections or additions were made. Motion by DG-Elect Paul Carr to accept the report as presented; second by PDG Sandee Marshall. Motion passed.

Governor's Opening Remarks: DG Leon Hove thanked everyone for attending his last Cabinet meeting as District Governor. He remarked that he was both pleased and disappointed with the participation at events this year. Successes include programs and service projects at meetings, the rebirth of the SLU Club and possibility of a MSB club, serving at a Miracle League baseball event, two eye missions in the Soulard neighborhood and a new partnership with the Archdiocese of St. Louis and their rural mission program. Disappointments include no increase in meeting attendance, Lions taking a position and not following through, not exceeding our membership goal and the lack of a 2nd Vice District Governor for the coming year. He acknowledged that he was "preaching to the choir." Two awards were presented to Lions who were not in attendance at the State Convention: the Presidential Medal to Lion Pam Manuel (Pacific) and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship to Lion Ed Marshall (Wildwood Area). A certificate was also presented to Lion Jeanne Carton (Chesterfield) for attending a Regional Lions Leadership Institute. PCC Charlie Hartmann presented a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship to Lion Bill Biele (Creve Coeur) from the District 26-M2 Lions Eye Foundation. DG Hove mentioned that the Pacific Lions Club had volunteered to sort the items donated for the pediatric cancer comfort bags and that designer sunglasses could be purchased for \$20 to benefit the Eye Mission Foundation and the Eyeglass Recycling Center.

**GST:** Lion Pam Manuel thanked all who brought items for the pediatric comfort bags for St. Louis Children's Hospital and those who volunteered at the Feed the Need St. Louis event at Queeny Park. Our second local eye mission was held in Soulard on May 13<sup>th</sup>. Twenty-three people were fitted with glasses and one was referred for cataract surgery. She would like the next mission this fall to be in North County, possibly at Covenant House. Contact Lion Pam for information about volunteering with the Missouri Disabled Water-skiing Association on July 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> at Creve Coeur Lake. There will be a guest speaker at our August meeting.

**Diabetes:** Lion Ruth Boyer (Beaufort) is working on a trivia night this fall to replace the craft fairs. She reported that there will not be a Camp Jump Start this year as they cannot get interns to help. Remember to get your A1C checked once a year.

Mid-South Sight and Hearing: Lion Jennifer Winkeler (House Springs) reported that donations from our District this year totaled \$10,525. 98 patients are on the waiting list including 45 awaiting cataract surgery. A Cataract-a-thon was held June 3rd, restoring the sight of 25 patients. So far \$50,000 has been raised toward the \$80,000 goal to apply for an LCI matching grant to buy surgical equipment. Mid-South will again host the Lions Fun Zone at the Cooper Young Festival in Memphis on September 16th. You can become a Champion of Mid-South by making a minimum donation of \$10 a month using the Church Center app. The next quarterly meeting will be held August 5th in Memphis. Visiting Lions Day(s) will be April 12th and 13th, 2024.



Correct Operating Procedures for this year for processing requests. The Correct Operating Procedure is noted as follows:

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website <a href="https://lions26m2.org/resources.html">https://lions26m2.org/resources.html</a> for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- 7. The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
  - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
  - a. Assigned
  - b. In progress
  - c. Forwarded
  - d. Closed (Complete)
- 9. If <u>ANY</u> Lions club receives an independent request <u>OUTSIDE</u> of the LAS line, please contact the LAS chair with the following information.
  - a. Date received
  - b. Requestors Name
  - c. ZIP CODE
  - d. Club Name assisting
  - e. Date of completion

# Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute (GPLLI)

**Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute (GPLLI):** "Training to prepare Lions for leadership positions throughout the organization. The GPLLI program is customized to best accommodate the needs of the area."

WHEN: July 28-30, 2023

**LOCATION:** Northwest Missouri State University, Maryville Missouri.

COST: US \$220 per attendee if payment received on or before April 30, 2023.

Cost increases to US \$240 beginning May 1, 2023. Registration covers single occupancy room, seven meals, and all course materials. Lion attendees may request to room together if desired. Course fee is due no less than six weeks prior to the institute starting date.

**WHO:** "Qualified candidates are Lions ready to pursue leadership roles within their Lions communities. Club Leaders would benefit from attending." NOTE: Previous attendees are not eligible to participate without prior approval from the Institute Coordinator.

This institute is being sponsored by Multiple Districts 3 (Oklahoma), 7 (Arkansas), 9 (Iowa), 17 (Kansas), 26 (Missouri), and 38 (Nebraska).

Dynamic facilitators from across the Great Plains will provide emerging Lion leaders with modules on diversity; goal setting; Lions fundamentals; local issues; mission statement; motivation; public speaking; time management; and working in teams.
